President's Column

First, I wish to apologize to all club members for not producing this letter for several months. I had a catastrophic computer crash and am now working on a borrowed machine. I hope to purchase a new one in the near future. Meanwhile, here is a quick update:

At the October meeting, Tom Fagan, WB7NXH, was named OPRC's ARCA delegate, replacing Cliff Hauser, KD6XH. Thank you Cliff for your service to date, and welcome aboard, Tom.

In October, the OPRC hosted the Tucson Hamfest. Weather was good and the event was well attended by vendors and by the public. The Radio Society of Tucson assisted by selling refreshments. The Boy Scouts participated in a Jamboree on the Air, testing was held, and ARCA held a meeting.

The Pueblo High School Amateur Radio Club set up an Amateur TV demonstration, linking the high school campus with the hamfest via a mountain top ATV repeater, Several of the club members present had recently taken part in a contact with the Internal Space Station. Thanks to all of the above plus to John Clor and his crew who put the event together.

At the November meeting, all officers of the club were drafted to remain in office one more year.

The December meeting was dedicated to the discussion of digital radio and television.

At the January meeting, Dave Brown, KC7CQY, our resident metallurgist, informed us of the problems associated with the phenomenon commonly known as "tin whiskers." The spontaneous growth of these metallic hairs can create a dead short in circuits including on microchip connections and on variable capacitors. They are controlled somewhat by mixing the tin with lead. However, the EEU has outlawed the use of lead in components, effectively making this a world standard. One alternative is to replace the lead with cadmium, a major carcinogen which can only be safely used by burying it deep in the innards of devices where it does not come into contact with humans. Using solders other than tin may require temperatures which are too high for use around heat sensitive radio parts.

At the February meeting, we hope to have a demonstration of radio-controlled model airplanes.




