The letter that follows your call sign on the address label tells ADAW distribution the club to which you belong. It is not a designation of your license class. Therefore, a "T" does not mean "Technician" and an "A" does not mean "Advanced." The letter identifies your club.

ADAW also does not accept change of address forms from readers. The clubs' membership chairperson provides ADAW with their current membership roster and ADAW incorporates it into the ADAW mailing list. Club members should notify their club of any address, call, etc. change and the club will relay the information to ADAW.



4. When you are finished announce:

"This is K*7*** ending autopatch" then, without releasing the transmit key, press"#" for at least one second and then release the key.
