The most telling comment in my mind was Larry's when he said, "I didn't get my license just to play on the radio. I needed to use it to help."

Now for a serious note. We lost a member last year. Ron Reynolds, N7WTF passed on. I mentioned it before, but many don't know that the public service group paid tribute to Ron during the recent MS-150 event. I have had mail indicating that I should again pay tribute to Ron. I couldn't do justice to what the event committee did. So I will publish their tribute. This tribute was read during the event. Anyone active in public service knew Ron's call was Mobile 52 or Safety 52. During the event the call went out Mobile 52. No answer and this tribute was read:

Ron Reynolds SK. Ron obtained his license in March of 1992 because he was helping with a couple of charity walks and saw how much the Amateur Radio Operators helped. In the fall of 1992, he worked his first MS 150 Best Dam Bike Route as a ham and was totally hooked on Public Service activities.

In 1994, he was asked to head up the Amateur Radio response team at the Maricopa county Office of Emergency Management and to build a system to coordinate Amateur Radio response to any problems at the Palo Verde Nuclear Generating plant and any other situation that arose in the county.

As he became more involve with the local public service group, he moved up the unofficial chain of command until 1995 when he became the public service chair of the Scottsdale Amateur Radio Club.

In 1996, he was asked to move into the net control team of the MS 150 and to be the ARRL District Emergency coordinator for Maricopa County.

In 1997, along with Jim Pierce N7QVW, he led the

coordination of Amateur Radio support for Public Service events in the Phoenix area. At that time there were 12 events.

Over the next six years new events were added and a training program was created to assist operators in becoming part of the professional organization. In 2002, the organization that Ron started was supporting 32 events including a full marathon and a 5-day bike ride in Northern Mexico.

In later years, Ron's illness restricted his participation in Amateur Radio Public Service events.

N7WTF, Ronald Reynolds was born in Scottsdale, passed away December 24th, 2007 at his home in Prescott Valley at the age of 45.

We dedicate our support efforts this weekend to his memory.


