

We are now the "HARKINS HAM SHACK!" Thanks to a donation from the Harkins family to the Science Center after they made a visit to the "old" W7ASC shack. There was a reference to "Red" Harkins' ham station on page 6 in the Harkins Theaters 75 Anniversary Issue, September 21, 2008 in the Arizona Republic:

"1940-1942 - At home at the College Theater. Red saves enough money to buy land and build the College Theater (now called the Valley Art Theater). He fills it with innovations such as glow-in-the-dark carpeting, headphones for the hearing impaired and electronically controlled drinking fountains. He builds an apartment upstairs. Includes a projection booth, an electronics lab, ham station, kitchen . . . "

George Stickney, W7BXW, reports that in the 1956 Radio Amateur Call Book Magazine is the following:

W7EAQ Dwight E. Harkins, College Theater, Box 915, Tempe, Ariz. Note that QRZ.COM does not list the call, so it has not been reissued to date. We are listed on the AZ Science Center web page as: "Harkins Ham Shack: explore the world of radio communication through first-hand experiences at the Ham Shack. During emergencies, telephone lines and wireless service can be disrupted and amateur radio operators have stepped in to help. You can even build your own radio!"

The W7ASC Ham Shack is on the third floor in the AZ Science Center's new "My Digital World" area. We still have a lot to do yet to get everything

operational. Stuff to be done includes resolving computer software issues (that's probably ongoing!), function modes for the LCD screens, and getting the cabling, graphics, lighting, shelving, and "signage" in place. The "GOBO" light should have the W7ASC call sign and "Harkins Ham Shack." Another hurtle is the

PC servers. The Science Center does not want to have servers compromising their firewall so we may have to set up an independent system or just leave the two computer stations connected as before into the ASC system.

Ham Radio Deluxe seems to be working now on the "digital" station to control radio tuning and tracking when the radio is manually tuned. Next is to install a mic extension and speaker audio extension.

The Fall Tech class starts Saturday, October 11th, 10:00AM to 1:00PM at Mesa Community College (Southern & Dobson in Mesa). So far we have eight students signed up - not all that big, but better than last fall. The License test will be at the last class session on November 22nd.


I am also requesting that members consider running for club office. We hope to have a slate of candidates established by the November meeting, 12 November 2008. Elections will take place at the December.


