Hi all,

It's been awhile since I've subjected you to my ramblings. Space restrictions have meant that the editor's column be removed to accommodate club news. I'm sure you'd much rather read about what is going on in your club. This month, however, I have important news regarding your ADAW.

The postal service has some new requirements for bulk mailers, which isn't all that surprising as they seem to roll out new rules on a frequent basis. One of these new requirements affects ADAW and ADAW clubs. All addresses to which a bulk mailer sends must be verified as correct no more than 95 days prior to the mailing.

There are a number of ways to comply with this regulation, each with its own associated cost to the mailer. ADAW has chosen to use the "Return Service Requested" method as it is the least costly option. To put it simply, if an address is incorrect, the piece is returned to ADAW with the reason for the return noted on it. If there is a change of address, the new address is listed on the sticker applied by the post office, provided the forwarding order has not expired. ADAW is charged the current first-class postage rate for each piece returned (currently 42 cents) which is then passed along to the club.

Therefore, it is vitally important for club members to keep their address current with their club and that club membership chairs communicate these changes to ADAW in a timely manner. Making sure all addresses are correct and current will reduce the expense to ADAW and the clubs while ensuring that members receive their copy of ADAW. So, if you are moving (or have recently moved), be sure to let your club's membership chair know right away. And don't forget to update your address with the FCC. It's a requirement that the FCC has your current and correct address on file. I've heard that they were randomly sending out letters to licensees just to check if their address was current. It could mean losing your license

if the FCC sends you a letter and it is returned. Did you check out the RST Hamfest in Tucson on

April 4? It was held at Kino Sports Park (the same venue as the OPRC event in October). There was a good crowd of both sellers and buyers when we got there. RST is planning another event next year, but the date has not been firmed up yet. Watch ADAW for the 2010 RST Hamfest and plan to attend.

Hope everyone had a great time at the AARC Hamfest on April 11. We didn't make it this year and certainly missed going.

The next event in Arizona is the Larry Warren Memorial Hamfest sponsored by the Cochise Amateur Radio Club in Sierra Vista on May 2. The hamfest is held at the club site on Moson Road and is a good reason to get away for a weekend. Mark your calendar.

That's about it from me this month. Enjoy your ADAW and don't forget to verify that your address is correct!


