Great hamfest SARC! Thanks for all your hard work making it happen. Looking forward to next year!


The next hamfest in Arizona is AARC's annual event at DeVry University. There's a flyer in this month's edition of ADAW with all the details. Hope to see you all there.

Three Thursdays a month the Arizona Amateur Radio Club holds its weekly 2-meter net using the repeater licensed to Lee Walters, W7UXZ, yet the majority of the participants in the net have never seen Lee's repeater and undoubtedly don't know anything about it. Lee graciously allowed me to look it over and photograph it so that the club can have a bit more knowledge of the W7UXZ repeater. The repeater was designed by Lee in 1975 and went on the air in 1976 as WR7AGP on the same 147.060 frequency it currently uses.

When you look at the photo of the front of the repeater/ power supply rack (photo 1) you will see a blank plate at the top. This is the transmitter, which is a 30-watt Motorola Micor. Beneath that is the repeater control unit, which was built by Lee. Some of it was Lee's design, and some parts used pre-designed plans. Bill Hosking, W7JSW, for instance, designed the CW ID unit. Beneath the control unit is another blank plate. This is the receiver, a Motorola M-type. Beneath the receiver is a 50-amp commercial power unit made by Astron. This keeps a charge on the 12 V. battery which powers the repeater.

Now let's take a look at the back of the equipment rack (photo 2). Again at the top you see the transmitter and notice that it is designed so the heat rises and keeps the transmitter from overheating. When you look at the control unit beneath the transmitter you will notice five boards. The boards are more easily seen in photo three. They were hand built by Lee. The functions of the boards are as follows:

- CW ID unit
- Timer/control logic
- Control Function Decoder
- Touch Tone decoder (DTMF)
- Automatic telephone answering device

(designed by Lee)

Beneath the repeater/power supply rack is the duplexer cabinet upon which a black pass/reject cavity is mounted (see photo 4). The duplexer allows a single antenna to be used with both transmitter and receiver at the same time. The cavity further improves isolation between the two. The duplexer was purchased commercially and was tuned by the manufacturer to the 147.660/147.060 MHz repeater frequency pair.

The antenna system in Lee's backyard (photo 5) is

supported by a tower which was put up in the 70's. On top of the tower is the Phelps Dodge Stationmaster antenna, a vertical which is commonly used with commercial repeaters. You will also see Lee's other antenna which he uses on 450 MHz and 2 meters. The coax running from the repeater to the vertical antenna is a combination of «" hardline and RG-214 double shielded cable as required for effective repeater operation. Although the repeater has been licensed for more than thirty years, it still fulfills the current repeater requirements as W7UXZ. Not only the AARC, but many other amateurs use Lee's repeater and are grateful for the efforts he has made to provide this for our amateur community.

Now that you have a bit of an idea about the appearance and operation of the W7UXZ repeater, we invite all amateurs, nonmembers of AARC included, to check into our Thursday net. It meets at 147.060 at 7:30 P.M. every Thursday except our meeting night, which is the second Thursday of each month, and on that Thursday we welcome all to our club meeting. The AARC meets at the Red Cross Building, one block north of Bethany Home Road on the northbound access road of I-17. Nonmembers who wish to attend a meeting should contact Gary, K7GH, at (602) 996-8148 at least a day before the meeting. This is a requirement of the Red Cross for security reasons.

We are pleasantly surprised to see a rather sudden surge the past few months in the number of applicants requesting to be tested by volunteer examiners, and we are especially happy with the high success rate. The February 27th VE test session held by the Arizona Amateur Radio Club produced two technicians, three generals, and one extra.

Our next meeting will be focused primarily on finalizing plans for our April 10 Hamfest. Some members have suggested various types of anti-rain dances that could be performed to insure that we would not have a repeat of last year's deluge, but the consensus of opinions is that since we had sixteen sunny hamfests and only one with rain, wind, and hail, the odds of having good weather are high. The included flyer has all the details of the April 10 Hamfest. Plan to join us, meet friends, find a bargain or two, and just maybe you'll see your photo in the next ADAW.




