Hi Guys,

The program for November was a great DX-pedition video to an island in the Caribbean. I was just amazed at the number of people involved in this adventure. They had spectacular results. Great video!

For next month we will have our annual banquet at Scottsdale Community College Culinary Arts dining room. Our speaker will be Mr. Bruce Winter. He runs a River Rafting company on the Colorado river through the Grand Canyon. I have never been river rafting but always wanted to try it. So, I am looking forward to this program and the great social event with the MARC club. I will have more about this next month. The room opens at 5:30 P.M. and the dinner begins at 6:00 P.M..

Bonnie and I took a vacation trip to New England. We flew into Boston, rented a car for the week and then set out to tour New England. Our first stop was Lexington and Concord. We walked on the village green where the Revolutionary War began. From there, we headed for Middlebury, Vermont and a Morgan Horse farm. We used to have a Morgan when Bonnie and I lived in New York state. This farm has quite a long history beginning in the middle of the nineteenth century. They once produced horses for the US Cavalry. It is now run by the University of Vermont. There was the most spectacular barn you ever saw. Built in 1880 it looked very well kept and with the surrounding hills of color it had a very pleasing old time feeling. I will have to return some day. From there we went to Waterbury, Vermont, the home of Ben and Jerry's ice cream. This facility is huge. There were many tourists there along with us to take tours and roam through the gift shop.

The fall leaves were in full color as we continued on our tour through the hills of New Hampshire. We saw many covered bridges that looked like a post card. It rained a little but that only made the trip better. In Freeport, Maine we went to the L. L. Bean store and got the greatest status symbol, an L. L. Bean shopping bag. Also, while there, we went to Wicked Whoopie's bakery and had some Whoopie Pie. This has been featured on Oprah's TV show. From there, it was on to Acadia Island and Bar Harbor. We enjoyed a fine restaurant there and walking through a small museum about whaling.

On the way back to Boston, we spent some time in Salem, touring some of the historical Witch Hunt locations from 1692. Of course we were there in October near Halloween. The town goes all out with ghosts and witches everywhere. We toured Nathaniel Hawthorn's "House of the Seven Gables." We walked up and down streets where the Puritans

once walked and we saw how they lived. We even toured a cemetery. An eerie feeling to be sure.

We finally returned to Boston and spent a couple days there touring the town and its many historical locations. We took a personally guided tour of the town with a delightful fellow who not only knew about the historical locations, but a lot of personal history about notable people who live in Boston. There were many locations to visit and having someone else do the driving makes for a fantastic trip. One of the highlights of the tour was a trip to the harbor. The USS Constitution is berthed there. It was commissioned in the 1790's and is still on the roster of US Navel Vessels. We toured the ship. Amazing. It was called "Old Iron Sides" because cannon balls bounced off her sides. Actually, she is planked with 4-inch Live Oak planks. This ship was a lot bigger than I thought she would be. I was impressed at her magnificent condition after so many years. There is a crew of navel personnel stationed on the ship, which is the reason for the spic and span appearance.

Because my ankle was not back to 100%, we did not do as much walking around as I would have liked. We did thoroughly enjoy New England, especially during this autumn season when the leaves are at their peak of color.

There will be the annual ARRL sweepstakes this month. I hope the HF bands improve a lot for this event. I have never managed a clean sweep, but I will try again. Next month I will let you know how this turns out. And of course, you all can jump in there too.
