The pictures of the devastation in Haiti following the violent earthquake on 12 January 2010 are heartbreaking. Supplies and assistance, though slow in reaching those in need due to the enormous destruction, are finally getting into the country and making its way to the people. More is needed - quickly.

Many amateur radio operators have mobilized to provide whatever assistance they can. Amateurs from the Dominican Republic traveled to Haiti on 15 January to set up emergency equipment at their embassy in Haiti. Unfortunately, they were forced to return to the Dominican Republic only hours after arriving for safety reasons. Unfortunately, they were not able to activate the station in Haiti. They were able to install two VHF repeaters in the Dominican Republic linking their capital, Santa Domingo, with Port-au-Prince. Only one of the repeaters is in operation. These repeaters are being used by the Red Cross and Civil Defense as there is no other way to communicate.



With the bands getting better that should be fun. Also, I would like to get to as many Hamfest around the state as possible. The first Hamfest for the year was the WestFest 2010 in Glendale, AZ.

I went to the WestFest 2010 and worked at our club table. It was a great event with a lot of vendors and buyers. I saw many happy buyers leaving with everything imaginable. These events also give you a chance to meet with old friends you haven't seen for a while. If you have not attended one lately, you should give it a try. Whether you buy something or not I am sure you will enjoy the experience.

In the past few months I have become aware of aspects that I never knew existed in the lives of several of the AARC members. Everyone has hidden secrets that could be revealed, and that is what I intend to do in this column. I'll begin with something buried in my own past and in the past of Gary Hamman, K7GH, something that most of you probably don't know. In the year 1968, there was a Southwest Division ARRL convention held in Phoenix, and on September 1 during that convention, Gary Hamman, then W7CAF, and I set a world DX record on CW over a 3720-foot path on 40,100 MHz, a record that was soon broken, of course. Our photo was published in a couple of the national amateur radio magazines at that time.

Now I'd like to share some other hidden secrets. Some of you may know that Dick Thomas, AC7SW, is a published author, but you may not be aware of the extent of his literary ability. Dick wrote a book called Chicken Tommy, which is a history of Humboldt Township, Illinois, from the years 1830 through 1993. Not only is it interestingly written, but it is a masterpiece of research into that area of the country. Dick was at one time a telegrapher with the railroad, which uses a code system slightly different from that used by amateur radio, so Dick's latest project is getting proficient in CW for field day. Making the change may be more difficult than leaning code the first time!

Did you know that Shel Stone, K7SLS, (who by the way no longer has his mustache since the Celtics lost to the Suns) once had a job building little animated figures for the bottom of aquariums? He has held several unique positions during his life, but this is probably his most unusual. He'd probably stump the panel on "What's my line?" with that one. The position that pleased him most, however, was his work with Marquardt which involved making the pitch and attitude rockets for the first three moon shots. He is proud to have been part of that project.

Here's a what's-my-line stumper for you. What do you think Bob Milburn, KB7TWF, did for a living? I was surprised to learn that he was a John Deere dealer in the Midwest.

I learned that Leslie Hickey, N5LDH, our AARC secretary, has transformed her daughter's old bedroom into a haven for doll houses. Leslie's hobby is building doll houses, and she

now has four large ones, a farmhouse, a Victorian home, an English cottage, and a general store, as well as a couple dozen smaller ones. Leslie shows skill as well as patience in this interesting hobby.

Would you allow your thirteen-year-old to learn to ride a Harley Davidson? Apparently Larry Penrod, AC7FC, learned to ride one when he was in the 8th grade. As a result he spent seven of his 21 years with the police department riding a motorcycle. Harley Davidson awarded him a pin for 100,000 plus miles riding with the police department. This was apparently without an accident because his pin read "Riding and Still Walking."

Everyone has probably heard about the ham shack that Bob Sitterley, K7POF, has in his Chino Valley location. Did you know that his "small" collection of AM equipment contains about 14 receivers, two of which once served the late W7OIF, Al, from about 1939 to the late sixties? It also boasts about twelve AM transmitters, two of them homebrew AM KW's, one a Collins Amateur KW, and one small AM transmitter which was the very mobile that Gary, W7CAF (K7GH) used in his automobile when he was in college in the dark ages. Gary remembers being in QSO recently with Bob when Bob was using Gary's rig. All this and more can be used with the 15 or so working antennas from 160 meters to 440 MHZ. Ouite a station!

Apparently there are quite a few secrets buried in the past among our members. I have only touched on the surface, but in order not to write this book all in one session, let me take a break from this exposé and promise you part two next month. My bag of secrets is still full.

Meanwhile, AARC activity continues. At our last VE session, four of the five tests taken were passed. VE testing is an important part of the service that clubs can perform and we are proud that five of our members have clocked more than 90 sessions working as volunteer examiners.

Our January meeting, which has not taken place by this writing, will be one of planning. Our meetings are the second Thursday of each month at 7:30 P. M. at the Red Cross building one block north of Bethany Home Road on the northbound access road of I-17. 
