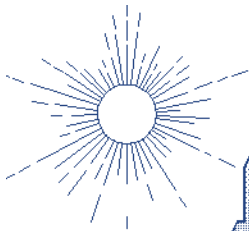

Thanks to George, KQ7C, for putting a conclusion to my column last month while we were traveling in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. Since we were on a planned tour which was quite tourist intensive, we did not bring amateur radio equipment, but we kept our eyes open for antennas along the way. No amateur radio antennas were sighted in Austria or Switzerland, but we saw two multi-band beams in Germany. Our German DX friends tell us that the Europeans are masters at hiding antennas. They also tell us that since antennas are legal there is no problem there with HOA's banning amateur antennas. In some areas of Germany we also noticed many miles of homes with roofs totally covered with solar modules. Apparently the Germans have realized that solar energy is a viable option, especially since power along with gasoline is very expensive.

Back in the United States we note that the Arizona Amateur Radio Club is getting out of the summer vacation phase. This month we resume VE testing at the Red Cross Building at 6135 N. Black Canyon Highway, just north of Bethany Home Road. Testing is the fourth Saturday of the month from September through June at 1900 hours. I hope your summer has been a pleasant one and that you, too, are looking forward to the relief from the Phoenix heat and to many great amateur radio events and projects.

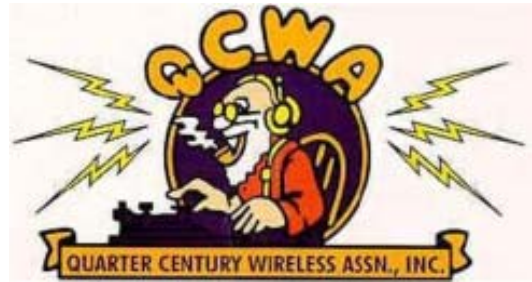

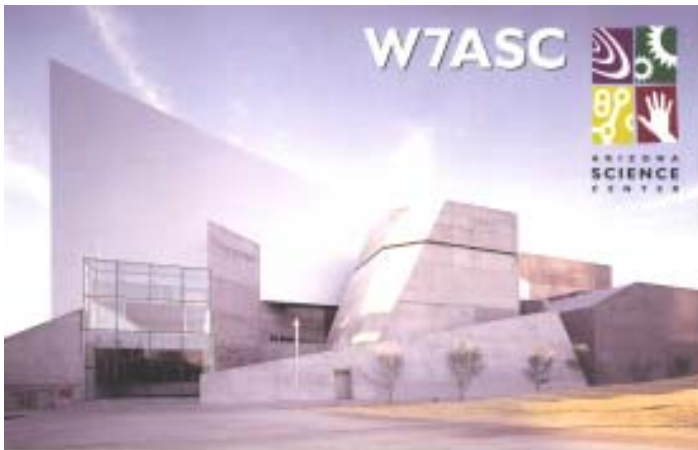

During the past months, several members who could not attend last December's meeting have asked me for some details and pictures from my QRP operations while traveling abroad. Since others might be interested, a brief summary of my presentation last year follows. I frequently take an Elecraft K1 with me when traveling in the USA and Europe along with a 43' antenna and 16' counterpoise both made from #26 wire and wound onto yo-yo reels (Fig. 1). The K1, antenna reels, N3ZN QRP key, mini-earphones, log book, etc. all fit compactly into a padded section of my carry-on computer bag (Fig. 2). Recent operations have been from the houses of friends in Norway (Figs. 3) and Germany (Fig. 4), and from my cousin's house in Northern Ireland (Fig. 5). I find QRP to be both fun and challenging. It is particularly enjoyable in Europe where QRP CW enjoys considerable activity on 20, 30, and 40 meters. During the past five years of very casual operating in Tucson while running five watts or less and using simple wire antennas, I have achieved WAS and nearly completed DXCC.

The next luncheon meeting will be on Saturday, December 11th at the Horny Toad Restaurant in Cave Creek.
