

# President's Column

As I write this today we are still almost two weeks away from Thanksgiving, but I must wish you a Merry Christmas since I am writing this column for the December issue of ADAW. At our November meeting we made plans for the December meeting, our annual holiday get-together, which will be on our regular meeting night, December 13. It's always a VERY special occasion. The food is good. The spouses are usually in attendance. And bingo, George Cooney style, is always exciting.

Our program at the November meeting was enlightening. President Gary Hamman, K7GH, explained and demonstrated the use of an SWR analyzer to find the length of coax, the impedance of coax, how far it is to a short or open, and the SWR of an antenna.

Today I stopped to visit with member Dick Thomas, AC7SW. Dick had hip replacement surgery a week and a half ago and is now residing temporarily in a rehab center in Scottsdale. The surgery was apparently very successful, and Dick is finding some interesting pastimes during the weeks he has had to be away from home and his radio. One of Dick's special talents is writing. You may be aware that he has authored a book entitled Chicken Tommy, which he claims is a kind of history of Humboldt Township, Illinois, a history written with an interesting and humorous style. He also wrote an article for Country Magazine about shucking corn in earlier years. This article was published in the September issue. While Dick is biding his time at the rehab center, he has been doing some work in preparation for an article he hopes eventually to send to QST comparing American Morse code to International code. I'm intrigued after hearing some of Dick's comments. He tells me that in using the American Morse the word "Mississippi" starts with two dashes for the "M," but after that it is all dots, since the "p" in American Morse is five dots. Furthermore, the sentence "She cries cuz she is so sorry" would contain all dots using the American Morse system. I learned a bit more about the American and the International code systems, but I'm going to save that for you to discover when you eventually see Dick's article in QST. I'm looking forward to it.

The AARC recently received an email from Jeff Demers, N1SNB, telling about a new program to support youth activity on the HF bands. His company, Amateur Radio Supplies LLC, of Haverhill, Massachusetts seeks to help a few lucky young hams get on the HF bands and make some contacts. Getting on the air after getting a first license can be a little challenging. Do you know any deserving young hams? 


