

Twenty-two members and guests attended the Winter meeting of the AZ Chapter QCWA at the Horny Toad Restaurant in Cave Creek on Saturday, December 10th. After a delicious buffet lunch was enjoyed by all, President Doug Besemer, KØVPL, led introductions around the room and introduced the speaker, Grant Hays, WB6OTS and AAA9O, Chief, Army MARS Operations.

Grant gave an excellent and informative presentation about "Army MARS Today." In addition to MARS support of military communications, other points of particular interest included the extensive role MARS plays during national disasters in providing emergency communications in support of FEMA, TSA, NASA, etc. MARS also provides training of military personnel to operate and maintain communication equipment since radio operators are no longer being trained by the Army. He also reported that there is a resurgence in the use of cw and digital modes on the HF bands to provide worldwide communications. This is cost effective since it is dependent on the ionosphere and not satellites and the internet which are expensive to maintain and also vulnerable to attack.
