

## WHAT ARE WE DOING HERE? AND - Why should you join us?

Before we get started - an anecdote: John K7JP was on duty in the station when a lady appeared, joined by her children. She asked John to get on the Mt. Ord VHF repeater and call KD7YIB. When the Ham responded, the children recognized his voice. It was Dad!

To those of us who have been on the air a few times, this seems pretty ordinary. To the kids, however, this was magic. This was set up by the parents, just to give the kids a different kind of thrill. This is just a small sample of the fun that comes with volunteering at W7ASC.

Do not forget that the organization is registered with Arizona as Center for Amateur Radio Learning (C.A.R.L.) but the station is known to the FCC as W7ASC. While there are quite a few Science Centers, or Science Museums, not many host an Amateur Radio station. There was a Ham shack at the House of Science in New York City, but we have not heard them on air recently. There was also a Station at the Smithsonian on the mall in the District of Columbia, but they have gone silent. W7ASC has been operating in the Arizona Science Center since the building first opened to the public. One may conclude that the Volunteers, who operate the Station, must be doing something right. But just what is that "something?" The "Mission Statement," which may be found at the W7ASC Web site, addresses this question. Simply put, the Station exists to give visitors a small sample of Amateur Radio activity. The Station is also there to remind visiting Hams that there is much that can be done with that license. For those who are inactive, they are reminded that they are missing out on the various activities. If they have children, those children should have the opportunity to become involved. But that sample that is available to the visitor is difficult to specify.

Think of this objective as somewhat like those "Taste of . . "events in your community. Local restaurants offer samples from their menu. A few dishes that the owner offers in the hope that visitors will like the sample and then visit the establishment on a regular basis. The Station W7ASC has, generally speaking, the same objective with regard to Amateur Radio. But there is more!

This oversimplified analogy breaks down if one brings it into sharp focus. The restaurant has a manager who decides what to display. W7ASC decision maker speaks with many voices. Board meetings, and the general meeting, are very illuminating. The attendees each view ham radio through a different lens! And each attendee has an opinion regarding the best sample to set before the visitors. That difference in perspective makes for interesting meetings. That difference also makes it difficult to make rapid decisions.

The pace of amateur radio activities recently has seemed to increase to an overwhelming speed. So many enjoyable events, so much DX (I had forgotten what it feels like to be bitten by the DX bug), so many ways to enjoy amateur radio. Isn't that great?!

Many of us are still excited about the near-perfect Yuma hamfest. 
