While we are speaking of health, consider the apparent health benefits of Morse code. Very few high-speed CW operators have been observed to suffer from dementia. Unless you feel that addiction to CW is, in itself, a form of dementia. We will avoid starting down that path. Di-di-di-dit di-dit.

Snowbirds, bless their frozen noses, have begun to return to the W7ASC schedule. Those familiar call signs are back. Good timing! Activities at the Arizona Science Center are ramping up. Sometimes a seemingly common event can become a memorable one. I experienced one of those at Prepperfest while greeting people at the ham radio booth. Allen West, KG7NAJ, came over to the booth with a huge smile on his face and a new handie talkie in his hand. Allen had passed his technician license test at the June AARC test session, and he had just bought his very first ham radio. Our booth had a couple radio stations set up, and one of them was a 2-meter station. It was the ideal time and place for Allen to make his first ever amateur radio contact, so Gary Hamman, K7GH, gave KG7NAJ a call, and the rest is history. This was not actually a DX contact since the distance between the two stations was about twenty feet, but it was history for KG7NAJ, and I'm sure he will remember this —and so will I. It is very special to see a new young ham's enthusiasm about this new hobby, which in most cases becomes a lifelong adventure. I photographed this historic moment and included it with this article. I wish I had a photo of my first contact. I was probably shaking in my boots with mike fright!

It's not very unusual for me to receive an email from my friend Reinhard Geissler, DL1UF, who now lives in Phoenix. Early this morning, however, receipt of his email was very memorable. On November 9, 1989, the Berlin Wall came down. Here is the email I received from Reinhard today, November 9, 2014:

"This is an important day today for me... The Berlin Wall fell 25 years ago today ***

Three weeks earlier, I visited my friends, Gisela (DD6CQ) and Siegfried Jakob (DL7NT) in West Berlin and I remember all too well how stunned we were when we heard the news that Honecker, East Germany's Ruler, had been forced to resign. This all was totally inconceivable as the Wall looked as threatening then as ever. Back at my relatives' place in Rhineland-Palatinate, I got a call from Hermann (DC9UP) on the evening of 11/9. He was sitting in a hotel in the UK watching the news and told me that he just learned that East German officials opened the border in a totally unreal and surprise move. The following morning, I flew to the US and flight attendants fed the TV news into the overhead monitors as soon as it was possible. And, there he was, Tom Brokaw, standing at the Berlin Wall reporting this utterly dramatic development . . .

Nov. 9, 1989: NBC's Tom Brokaw reports from West Germany hours after the East German government announced that residents would be able to move freely between the countries for the first time in more than 25 years... and a few months later, together with my brother and sister-in-law as well

as Frank Smith (then KF7PO, AH0W, SK), I had the chance to chisel away at the Berlin Wall.

I had known little about the impact that the Berlin Wall had on the German people, and I won't easily forget this morning's email. I have already framed the photo shown here of Reinhard knocking down the Berlin Wall.

By the time you are reading this ADAW, we will probably be taking photographs of another new radio station being put together for use by our young radio operators. As mentioned in the last ADAW, several groups have contributed equipment to young ham clubs who are starting out. To begin with the station will receive a GAP Titan vertical 10-80 meter antenna and a Kenwood HF transceiver, as well as a Kenwood TR-7400A 2-meter transceiver. Special thanks to Ruth Thomas, XYL of SK Dick Thomas; Diana Polanski, daughter of SK Leslie Hickey; and Jeff Hanna, WB7FY, for donating transceivers. By the way, I received a very positive review of the Gap Titan vertical from Reinhard Geissler. His comment: "While we were living in Prague, I was on the air as OK8EDC and used a GAP Titan vertical (the same antenna as the one donated to the PHX Country Day School ARC) and I was very happy with it."

At the present time, plans for the November 13 AARC meeting are being formulated. We anticipate getting a chance to see two of the Kenwood transceivers that were donated. We will also get to see John Adams' (K6JWA) new Kenwood transceiver. The program for the evening will be concerned with basic operating, using various radios, including the club's Yaesu FT450D, which is one of our popular Field Day rigs. Of course this meeting will also be a planning session for the December 11th Christmas party that we all look forward to.

Note: when filling out your ticket(s) PRESS HARD. THERE ARE 4 COPIES!!!



Technician licensees can help their communities by assisting in Public Service events, Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT), search and rescue, and as communication links in times of disaster.

"Hams" with the Technician FCC Amateur Radio license have privileges on all Amateur frequencies above 50 MHz.

Technician frequency privileges changed as of February 2007 to include SSB (voice) operating modes on the Amateur 10 meter band, and CW (Morse code) on the 15, 40, and 80 meter HF (short wave) bands. On UHF and VHF you can operate FM voice, Amateur TV, Packet, Satellite, IRLP, Echo-Link, and many other modes. One of the more popular is FM voice operation on the 2 Meter VHF and 70-cm UHF bands.

The **Technician amateur radio license testing session** will be Saturday, April 4th at DeVry (22^{nd} St & Dunlap). Other testing opportunities will be announced. 
