Happy February everyone. And Happy Valentine's Day too!



If you read the Arizona Repeater Association bylaws, Article 12.1 states "EMERGENCY AND PUBLIC SERVICE USES: The primary usage of the Corporation's repeater stations shall be for emergency and approved public service activities." That's the primary reason the ARA and many other groups/clubs go through the effort to install and maintain repeaters. The awesome secondary benefit is those systems are open for general amateur use at all other times.

When disaster strikes, Amateur Radio is famous for being able to communicate when all else fails. But to be effective when "the spam hits the fan," we need training and experience. In the Valley of the Sun, we use scheduled events like foot races, bicycle races, and walkathons as "disasters by appointment" to gain that real-world training and experience.

The biggest simulated disaster each year is the Ragnar del Sol relay race. It's the king of all emergency simulations for public service. The sheer size and duration of the event make it a challenge that's likened to organizing chaos. On the 3rd weekend of February each year, the ARA reconfigures repeater links to combine Rimlink and Metrolink and others to support this event. Over 50 hams volunteer to support the 202 mile, 40 hour relay race while tracking 4000-5000 people and 800-1000 vehicles.

Public service isn't about the radio. It's about serving people in ways that you can't do without the radio. Are you one of the few? For on air training, tune into the Metrolink system every Monday night at 9pm for the AEN-MAR net (www.AEN-MAR.org). The Pinal Sector 6 SkyWarn can be heard every Tuesday night at 8pm on the Rimlink system. For practical experience in public service, check out MCECG (www.MCECG.net) to learn more and sign up.



#### THE "WAYBACK" MACHINE, TOOLS, AND OTHER STUFF

But first! Big year for C.A.R.L. - 2015 marks the 20th anniversary for C.A.R.L. and Arizona Science Center, demonstrating Ham radio for visitors to the Center.

Into the "Wayback" machine and set for 1995! A little CARL history and contacts some of the folks starting up CARL and the Ham Station in 1995 were:

Pollack, Dave [SK] Ham Emeritus Barr, Ralph W0DNO Zinder, David W7PMD Horwitz, Charlotte KB7TKQ Horwitz, Rick AB7FH Craner, Ralph KV0R

The first Ham display at the Science Center (2nd and Adams St.) was "Tech Zone" in the summer of 1995. Two kiosks were manned using Ray Sumner's call NW7R. We did it again in 1996 using our new club call of KC7LUL for "Ham Daze," followed by the vanity call W7ASC. Several meetings were held with Arizona Science Center to get a Ham station established. See

http://www.redwaveradio.com/7\_886d1a74f8cb116e\_1.htm for a write-up on the 1996 special event station.

Many things have changed since 1995. No more Morse code is required for a license. Ham radio has a few more frequencies. The national Ham population has continued to grow, exceeding 700,000 at last count. The station call W7ASC was requested and granted. Ham radio Technician license classes, held at Arizona Science Center and Mesa Community College, have added more than 30 new Hams per year. A number of Arizona Science Center volunteers and employees are now licensed. A good twenty years. You, as a Volunteer, can help to make the coming years even better.

In your last ADAW Newsletter, we started to enumerate the Ham radio software tools that are often available at No Charge. Tools that fulfill various Ham-related functions. Ham Radio Deluxe that allows onscreen control of certain rigs. EchoLink, and EchoMac that marry Ham radio and the Internet. Programming tools. PSK31 and related protocols. But we need not use up Newsletter space for this information. If you can say Internet, you can say, and type, Google. Search on various combinations of the words Ham Radio No-cost Software. Try other words as well. There is a large body of amazing software available. And for your tablet or smart phone, you can find a Morse practice key in various forms. We suggest Morsekey, a free app. There are others. Visitors to W7ASC who have done their names in Morse code are encouraged to install this app and continue to work on their code skills. We continue to be amazed to see young children

sporting an iPad or other tablet. We continue to search for other Ham-related apps that we could suggest as a means to providing a memory refresh that will remind them of the experience when they visited W7ASC. And here, dear reader, is a chance for you to make a contribution. If you are aware of an app, or two, that ties the user to the Ham experience, please send the information to your faithful scribe, Jean, at jeanjol@hotmail.com.

We note that many youngsters tell us that they have heard about Morse code in school as a part of a history lesson. Few, if any, however, express familiarity with the Heliograph.

Now for your assignment, preparation for your shift as a volunteer at W7ASC. Time at the station is not all Morse code and QSO's. There is substantial conversation, and you are often challenged by a visitor. Be prepared! Lead the conversation in a positive direction. The visitor who leaves with a better understanding about Ham radio might be the crucial vote on the City council. Or even on your HOA board. Objective: turn every visitor into a Ham radio supporter. Make no enemies!

Here are some of the questions that are addressed to Volunteers. This is not a comprehensive list - just some samples. Do your homework. You can use these questions, and their answers, at any social occasion when the subject of Ham radio becomes a part of the conversation.

"Why bother with a license? I can buy a CB and be on the air without any study or testing."

"Why would anyone, in this day and age, want to learn Morse code?"

"Who needs Ham radio? We have our cell phones."

"Ham radio must be almost dead. I don't see those towers anymore."

"Hasn't the Internet made Ham radio obsolete?"

"Hams are just a bunch of old guys who use funny language and use equipment that makes odd noises. Does nothing for me."

"Where is the bathroom?"

Even if you are unable to Volunteer, perhaps you know of a Ham who is now retired but wants to stay active. Volunteering at W7ASC is a great way to enjoy this great hobby in retirement. Yes, you are reading the February issue of ADAW, but I am writing my musings in January, a time to look at accomplishments or lack of the same. How did AARC do in 2014? We did VERY well.

A few weeks ago I attended a presentation by Marty Shultz, a very successful businessman who has been responsible for much of the state's progress in the areas of tax, transportation, education and energy. The Phoenix Community Alliance (PCA) started out of Marty's office, and it is known as the major, private sector catalyst of Greater Downtown Phoenix. Marty's advice concerning success is to focus on the youth since they are our future. This certainly applies to amateur radio, and during 2014 the AARC VE testing program has licensed more than fifty new amateurs, many of them young applicants. In addition many licensed hams have upgraded to a higher class license. Seventeen of our members have participated as license examiners. Joe Cutitta, WOSLL, 2014 ARCA Ham of the Year, has served as VE 283 times. 

If you looked at these contests, you may have noticed that the implied goal is to achieve a high score and the score is usually computed by multiplying the QSO total value by a total multiplier value. The value assigned to each QSO is usually 1, but may vary – sometimes 2, as in the ARRL contests for cw QSO's vs 1 for ssb QSO's, or a higher number for the higher frequency band QSO's in the ARRL VHF Contest. The multipliers may be assigned for new sections or countries or call letter prefixes (in the CQ WW WPX Contest). And the multipliers may be applied for each band or for the whole contest. For instance, if you operate in the ARRL January VHF Contest and make 10 contacts (QSO's where you exchange call letters and grid square numbers for each) all on 2 meters FM in 5 grid squares your total score would be 50.

I may not operate in all these contests, but I'd be happy to try to answer your questions: telephone 630-209-4116 and/or JFSiepmann@hotmail.com.

Remember you can always casually participate in these contests or most any contest and spent a few minutes or a few hours to become familiar with the events. Actually only a minority (typically 10% to 25%) of the operators are really serious contestants and most will be happy to take a few moments to help out newbies – we all have been newbies.

BTW, the Jan. 17 ARRL VHF contest might be of interest to many of our club members – modes are "any", e.g. cw, ssb, fm, digital – any. Take a look at it.






