FIELD DAY?

WHY THE QUESTION? This Newsletter must meet a June 10 deadline for inclusion in ADAW, even though it is dated July. So what is your humble scribe to do? Wait until August, when memories of the activities will have faded? Or perhaps write a fictional report. Why not? Some famous reporters have done that for years.

As this newsletter is being penned (word-processed?), the volunteers at the W7ASC station are deep into planning a memorable Field Day at the Arizona Science Center. Lots of "Do your name in Morse Code" stations. Perhaps some Hams wandering the halls and galleries with hand-held radios giving demonstrations in the midst of the visiting multitudes. There might even be a map posted in the station kiosk with map pins marking the day's contacts.

A large screen presentation on ECOM will be in the "My Digital World" gallery, and, not to be overlooked, SkyWarn material will be made available to visitors. Perhaps that will bring forth a few questions. The Team will be prepared to answer at least some of the reasonable ones. No – we do not control the weather, remotely or any other way!

If everything is functioning properly, the Station will hold live demonstrations of PSK31 and Echolink. VHF/UHF contacts are virtually guaranteed. HF activity is, of course, less predictable.

Ham volunteers will be answering questions and handing out flyers, activity schedules, old QST copies and reprints of the latest ADAW newsletter. Bob, KG7QJ, is, even now, working to assemble a large group of volunteers so that Ham Radio will be a large part of the Arizona Science Center visitor experience on Field Day.

Do you, fellow Hams, really wonder why we do this? This action is not really in the "field." We do it in order to entertain and inform the visitors, to give them some idea of what we, as Hams, do in order to prepare for that day (that we all hope never arrives) when we have no power from the utility, but communication is suddenly critical to the citizens. Field Day, as you well know, is, at its core, a practice session. Field Day at the Arizona Science Center is an opportunity to inform some of the citizens that might require our services. That message can often be lost in the noise. Our intent is to pull it out and put it into focus.

Monthly meetings are on the 3rd Tuesday of the month. Schedule, location, and agenda are posted on our website. Meetings open to anyone interested in amateur radio or to just listen to feature presentation and have a bit to eat.

W7MOT.org website continues with small improvements. Check it out. This month a "Report a Repeater Problem"; Main Menu, hover the cursor over "Repeaters," select (click on) "Report a Repeater Problem." Use this to report a problem or make a comment, click send, and it's emailed to Site Managers and Tech Chair. Simple. Knowing how these repeaters are performing or misbehaving is important to us. MARCA owns and operates several voice, APRS, and digital repeater systems, all with the call W7MOT-(something). See website for repeater, locations, and user information.

Did you know MARCA, in partnership with the ARA, hosts the W7MOT DStar system on White Tanks? It's a full DStar system of four repeaters; UHF Voice, VHF Voice, 1.2Ghz Voice, and 1.2 GHz Data. Repeaters are Repeaters; a DStar Repeater requires a Controller to functioning as a simple "repeater" or do "cross band." And yes, if the Controller gets sick, it can cause one or all of the repeaters to act funky.

"Linking" to distant DStar repeaters (globally) requires a Gateway Server plus Internet. And yes, this steps up the complexity factor with a Linux server, local area network, firewall, and internet service. And yes, all the equipment is co-located on White Tanks.

There are three DStar Systems in the Phoenix Valley: W7MOT on White Tanks, KE7JFH on Usery Mt., KG7HBZ B (UHF only) in Goodyear, and two systems in Tucson area, K7RST on Mt Lemon, and KR7ST in Tucson. DStar users may link between these sites using any combination of repeaters at either end.

There is an Arizona Statewide "Reflector" (REF009C), hosted by Radio Society of Tucson, whereby each AZ DStar system links a repeater (typically UHF or B) to the Reflector. All linked repeaters function like one. At any time, any DStar repeater anywhere may link.

Not interested in Reflectors, then link a DStar repeater to another DStar repeater elsewhere in the US or Europe, or schedule a QSO via DStar back east or north or south or northwest. You get the idea.

So, with all the complexity, something might go amiss. It happens. W7MOT had a few rough days the end of May. Being a repeater admin or engineer for DStar is more than RF and antennas. The Gateway Server was hit by a stray neutrino (it happens to all computers). We suspected the Linux OS was hit. A reboot was required (just like Windows and Apples). After the reboot, an update to Dplus was installed. All is good

now. Users have reported the system is operating normally. Report problems using our reporting system.

You may not be aware of the W7MOT-14 (UHF) 442.975 MHz and W7MOT-15 (900 MHz)927.4375 MHz Repeaters located at Chandler Regional Hospital. They've been operational for about four years. However, they have been somewhat over shadowed by some of the building structure and for the past two years by the new five-story building addition.

Both the W7MOT-14 and W7MOT-15 were relocated this past June. The antennas are now located on the roof of the new five-story addition at 90 ft and with a clear view of the SE Valley horizons and mountains. The Repeaters were relocated to the 5th floor Telcom Rm.

W7MOT-14 is fully operational. Coverage area is greatly improved. Please give it a try and report your findings using our Repeater Reporting System. Include your Name, Call, email, location, signal report, type of radio, and Tx Power. This will help us develop a coverage map quicker.

W7MOT-15 is not on the air due to a Hardline issue, but should be by publication. Antenna, Repeater, Hardline, installation and testing are complete. Again, you are welcome to provide comments on this repeater using our Repeater Reporting system.

The site manager is TD Kennard, N7ISR. He can be contacted via email found under >>About Us>> Repeater Site Managers or the Repeater Reporting System.

The Fusion repeater at the Hayden GD Scottsdale site may not be live by the end of June. A new ARCOM controller is being assembled with factory Fusion modifications. Testing is scheduled before final installation.

Attention: The ARA does not hold a General Meeting in July. Our Technical and Board Meetings have also been canceled for July this year due to the proximity to the 4th of July holiday. Happy Independence Day to everyone and we hope to see you at the ARCA Williams Hamfest July 24-26th.

Quite a few changes have been made to the Arizona Repeater Association web site in the last year. Have you visited www.W7ARA.org recently? Gone is the static site developed years ago. The new web site has features added to deliver dynamic content to you on a regular basis.

The most recent and exciting change has been on the Membership page. The ability to join or renew your ARA membership online has been added. Under the Membership page, select Membership Application at the bottom. Once the form is filled out, you have the option to Submit and pay via any Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or AmEx card or log in and use your PayPal account. The form can still be printed and mailed in with a check, but we're excited to announce that this is no longer the only option.

The printed Squelch Tail was discontinued several years ago with the intentions of delivering the same content via the web site. Much of that is possible now. There are the public notices under the Squelch Tail button where we've been posting many updates each month. Included are the ADAW column, membership updates, general meeting summaries, repeater trip reports, and anything else that needs announced regarding the ARA. Check back here frequently for updates.

Under the Repeaters page, you'll find the largest chunk of content on the site. You'll find the listing of ARA site engineers and contact information for each. Next to that is a link to the Interference Report. It's very important and helpful if users of ARA repeaters fill this out with as much information as possible when problems occur. If there's intentional interference, listen to the input of the repeater, try to get a directional reading, and collect what information you can. Remember, even if you don't hear the interference directly, that information helps us determine where the signal is not coming from and is just as helpful. Interference reports are not just for intentional interference either. If you hear a repeater acting up or not working properly, fill out the form. This information will be passed on to a site engineer or the tech chairman.

We also have a link to the ARA Repeater Site Status. All of our sites are listed here and you can dive down to look at each radio at every location. We're able to change this page to keep it updated when there are problems or repairs in progress.

Our repeater information is also provided in two formats for downloading. The first is a two-page PDF file that has every repeater listed as well as helpful information on some of the linked systems. Print this out yourself or pick up a copy from

us at a hamfest. We've also added a CSV file format listing all of our repeaters. This can be opened in Excel and arranged how you want it. The default is sorted by frequency, but you can sort by the Name column to look at our repeaters by site or sort it by the Comment column to view our repeaters listed by linked system. The CSV file was created to be compatible with programming software as well, giving you the ability to easily program ARA repeaters into your radios.

Take a look at the Meetings page as well. Most of the information here does not change that frequently, but our program chair keeps the Scheduled Programs page updated with upcoming meeting topics. You can check which presentations will be happening on the 4th Thursday of each month and come join us. Remember, no meetings in July, but join us in August.

Log into the Member Services section as well. Once logged in, this is where the Membership Directory is located. It used to be printed annually and became outdated as new members joined or as people moved addresses. Information is now able to be kept current online. We're also able to post member-only notices within this page.

I hope you enjoy the new web site and find it useful. There are still more changes and updates we'll make in the future, so check back frequently.




