

W7ASC NEWSLETTER - Ham shack report

The level of activity has risen. Days and times that had traditionally been quiet, are now very busy. Visitors come early and stay late. There is no mystery about the driving force. The Pompeii exhibit has been a winner from the first day that it opened. Visitors who had never visited the Arizona Science Center are now flocking in to experience this current attraction.

Many of the visitors arrive just in time for their allotted time, then stay and wander through the rest of the Center. And that results in a serious increase in the number of Shack visits.

There is an interesting by-product to all of this increased activity. Many local Hams are included in this flood of visitors. Surprisingly, few are affiliated with any club. The Shack keeps a good supply of the most recent ADAW. This is a great handout, in general, but an even more useful publication for a local Ham who does not know that there are many clubs that are ready to welcome them. The ADAW copies literally fly off the rack. As you read this Newsletter, keep in mind that your club newsletter is being read by a group that includes new Hams who were not aware that you are there.
