



There is hardly ever a "regular" day at W7ASC. Visitors are varied in age, gender, education, interests, and even their residence location. Only a few visitors really understand Ham radio, so the challenge, for the Volunteer, is to fill in the gaps without seeming to lecture. Where does one start the conversation? One good starter is to ask about the visitors activities. The conversation should, after all, focus on what Ham radio might do for the visitor. Starting with the technology is usually a losing gambit. Why should a visitor care about antennas, modulation or frequencies? If, however, they are avid hikers or four-wheel off-road enthusiasts, communication from remote areas in the event of an emergency can be a useful capability. So we talk about that aspect of Ham radio. What can it do for the citizen, for the community? We look for resonance. Once that is achieved, we can move from the "Why" to the "How." This is a natural progression, but it only happens if the volunteer listens for that connection. Most visitors are only mildly curious about what Hams do, but their interest increases once they see a connection to their lives.

Steve WB4ZSC reported an incident that demonstrates a fact that all volunteers have observed. A group entered the Gallery while he was on duty. While the youngsters were running and shouting, the chaperon, who was there to watch over them, came to the Shack and engaged Steve in conversation. She wanted to know what went on there. Steve started by explaining the Morse code exercise. That chaperon interrupted, expressing the view that her charges would never have an interest in such an odd activity. Steve, who knows better than to argue with a visitor, simply invited one of her charges to do the code. Every volunteer has noted the way that this works. Just like schools of fish, the youngsters tend to move in clusters. Once they see activity shaping up, they all must participate. Steve was soon surrounded by cherubs who were lined up, waiting their turn to do the code. The chaperon, who had decided that this would never work for her group, was not to be seen. Steve handed out a serious number of badges to that group.

Which transitions to a related subject. Are they "Badges" or "Stickers?" C.A.R.L. has been handing out these labels for many years. They are self-adhering bits of paper that have been printed with the words "I did my name in Morse code" plus "at W7ASC" in Dits and Dahs at the bottom. When a volunteer hands one of these labels to a visitor when has just

completed sending the code - and, BTW, we never touch the visitor. The words that go along with the presentation make all the difference. If the visitor hears "Here is a sticker," the label almost always goes onto the code sheet, never to be seen again. If, on the other hand, the volunteer says "put this badge on your shirt, where others can see it and be jealous," it goes, with rare exceptions, on the shirt in full view. It might even be shown at school as a "Show and Tell" theme! The intent, in creating that badge, is to use it as both a reward and a recruiting tool. When making the award, do not be silent and, of course, do not refer to it as a sticker.

There are, of course, more stories of happenings at W7ASC. Would you like to share in the experience as a volunteer? Get to wear a purple shirt and get free parking? Talk to people about how Ham radio has enriched your life. (It has, of course and, possibly even extended it.) Call the number below, make an appointment to visit the Shack to see it in person. If you know any Hams who are retiring, please tell them that they would really enjoy volunteering at W7ASC.

No doubt there will be more stories in the next issue about the W7ASC scene. As usual, comments or contributions are always welcome by this scribe.

What is C4FM

The introduction of C4FM/FDMA technology is the beginning of a new digital communication system in Amateur Radio world. The most attractive advantage of digital communication is the ability to transfer data.

The 12.5 kHz channel spacing using the C4FM FDMA digital modulation mode allows data communication with reliable voice communication leveraging strong error correction performance. C4FM FDMA offers a 9.6 kbps data transfer rate speed. It differs significantly from existing digital radio systems and expands the possibilities for interesting amateur radio activities in the future.

The C4FM / FDMA technology provides three digital operating modes in addition to analog mode (FM).

The "DN" mode transfers voice and data communication at the same time leveraging two 6.25 KHz time slots. With this mode, voice and data (with GPS position and the ID) to be sent in the same time. In addition, the strong error correction contributes to the stabilization of the digital communication. This mode is the basic mode of C4FM FDMA Digital HAM radio system.

The "Data" mode uses the full data rate capacity for the transmission of data. This mode allows you to transfer large amounts of data, text messages, pictures and voice notes, etc., at faster speeds as other modes.

The "VW" mode uses the full data rate for voice transmission. This mode allows a near natural digital voice transmission. Although no data is included, the voice quality is the same regardless of the distance.

Analog FM mode operates as wide (25 KHz) or narrow (12.5 KHz) bandwidths. This mode is much the same as the current FM modes used by other VHF / UHF amateur radio stations.

One of the best features is the Automatic Mode Select. With this feature, the radio detects the incoming mode and switches the receiver and transmitter to the mode of the incoming signal. This includes the repeaters and allows stations to use any of the digital or analog modes through the same repeater.



Dave gave a terrific talk on the March 2018 9M0W DXpedition to the Spratley Islands by a large international team. This was a lesson in how Murphy can strike even the best planned DXpeditions. Although the team made 23,460 contacts, they had hoped to do twice as many, but were unexpectedly delayed two days in arriving on the island and then had power issues at the resort where they set up their stations.

This past month saw the Magic Band, 6 meters, come alive on schedule with the annual Sporadic E activity at unprecedented levels due to the popularity of FT8. A number of club members made dozens of 6m QSOs with stations across the USA, Canada, and Mexico and a few of us were lucky enough to catch multi-hop openings to Europe and Asia. The most memorable activity occurred on the morning of June 7th when I logged CT1IUA, EA5BY, EA5ISZ, PA2M, CT1BXT, EA6VQ, ON4GG, and EA1YV between 1529Z and 1700Z. Other club members logged many more European stations during this time and nearly all of it was done on the FT8 digital mode.

We are eagerly awaiting the upcoming DXpedition to Baker Island in the Pacific by the Dateline DX Association using the callsign KH1/KH7Z. Two CADXA members will be on that team – Ned Stearns, AA7A, and Bud Semon, N7CW. We wish them a safe and smooth journey and hope to hear them on many bands and modes. This will be the first opportunity to see whether the new DXpedition version of FT8 (Fox/Hound) that Ned helped develop can run at rates greater than ever seen before on a digital mode. You need to be prepared by downloading WSJT-X version 1.9.1 or later and selecting "Hound" on the File/Settings page, Advanced tab.


