

Now on to serious stuff: How we should use field day for more than just a family picnic.

Those of you who belong to ARRL are solicited for contributions to the Frequency Defense Fund. Why do we need to defend frequencies, and how is that done? The answer is simple. Our bands, if converted to commercial use, would be worth a lot – really big bucks. There are companies that really want those frequencies - the bands that are now our "privileges." These attempts come in the form of petitions to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). We defend our use of those bands by sending lawyers to attend those FCC hearings and testify on behalf of the Ham community. Lawyers cost money. These lawyers are paid from the Frequency Defense Fund. Our lawyers are up against wellfunded efforts from very large companies who would like to end Ham radio, take over those frequencies, and make a lot of money in the process. The effort to displace Ham radio never slows. Some efforts try to take just a slice of our bands. Some are more ambitious. If you think that we are in some way guaranteed our bands, then you live in a fantasy world. The price of continued ham use of these bands is constant diligence. So – beside sending \$\$ to the ARRL Frequency Defense fund, what can you do? Actually, you can do a lot, and Field Day can be a part of that effort.

Sending letters to your representative is certainly an important part of the process and should not be neglected, but the typical politician counts voters when taking a position. The entire Ham community is just a fly speck in the body politic. As individuals, we carry little weight. In order to be heard and to have our frequencies protected, we must recruit a "Force Multiplier." There must be a large chorus who see Hams as an irreplaceable asset to the community. Yes – we can always welcome new licensees, but what we really need to recruit is a large community of supporters who understand the role that we play in Public Service.



73, Brian McCarthy, AK7F ANSR flight 125.1 launched from the Prescott Hamfest and ARRL Arizona State Convention at Embry Riddle Aeronautical University without incident on June 1, 2019. ANSR flight 125, however, was another story. A miscalculation in the amount of lift required and the amount of Helium required to achieve that lift resulted in the initial flight falling victim to a downdraft, crossing a field at about twenty-five feet, and then getting caught in a stand of trees about 500 yards away.

Those watching the launch saw a number of ANSR launch crew members running across the field in hot pursuit. They were successful in getting to the balloon before anything happened to it, like an encounter with a sharp object. They freed the payload from the trees and walked the balloon back to the launch point, still intact.

More Helium was added, and a launch was again attempted about twenty minutes later. The flight was successful, achieving an altitude of about 72,000 feet. The flight time was about ninety minutes and ended up about 11 miles north of Williams, Arizona at 11:00 AM. Steve Thomas, KE7TLS, and Rick Cofone, K2CRC, recovered the flight from a pine tree using Steve's truck as a ladder. There were some issues with intermittent beacons, which will be part of our post-flight review.



Do you struggle to make contacts on HF because of Homeowner's Association (HOA) Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs)? Come hear our July program and see how it can be overcome.

Our July program is titled "The Challenges and Triumphs of DXing from HOA Land" and will be presented by Mickey, K5ML. After being QRT since 1983, Mickey became QRV from Paradise Valley in January 2007. There was just one slight problem: the HOA and CC&Rs stringently limited his antenna choices.

Nevertheless, from HOA Land he has worked 320 ARRL entities and 318 of them were worked using ground mounted verticals and low-level wire antennae. All countries were worked from 160 through 10 meters using only SSB and CW. Despite receiving several threats of legal action from the HOA, Mickey held off their threats and is still very active today.

In this presentation Mickey will discuss his legal battles and what he has learned about what it takes to be a successful DXer regardless of HOA restrictions. In previous years, he was known as Michael LeBoeuf, author, business consultant, and professional speaker. He promises to keep it interesting and may even throw in a joke or two.

Our June Presentation was "DXCC in a Weekend" from Bill, K6WSC, and was an entertaining look at DXing from a suburban lot while still logging 100 countries over a DX contest weekend.
