#### AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE DEMONSTRATION STATION

Due to an error last month, the Center for Amateur Radio Learning's column was inadvertently left out of the May issue. Here is the missing column in its entirety. .ed

W7ASC is a Demonstration Station for the Amateur Radio (public) Service. W7ASC is open to the public during those hours when the Arizona Science Center is open. The station is located on the third floor of the Science Center, in the "My Digital World" gallery.

It is good news to report that the Station has two new Volunteers. We have Larry W7LDT, a retired airline pilot, and Tony KI7VTY, still a working engineer. These Hams are new to W7ASC, but they are not new to Ham radio. Please give them a big welcome when you contact them on the air at W7ASC.

If you have been reading the W7ASC newsletter, as it has been appearing in the ADAW all these years, you are aware that you have read about the opportunity to do some teaching there, and to answer the interesting questions that the visitors bring with them. Do you believe that you can answer accurately and cheerfully? You might really be ready to go bigtime as a Volunteer at the W7ASC station. Here are a few samples.

Most frequently, the Volunteer on duty is asked for directions to the Rest Rooms. You will not find that answer in the Handbook. Since you might need the answer for yourself, find that location on your first Volunteer day.

Even young visitors will often ask if Morse code is still in use. Well - is it? You might want to do a bit of research in order to be prepared to answer this one. Be ready to amaze the inquirer with the answer.

Almost without fail, someone will ask why we care about Ham radio when almost everyone has a cell phone. Isn't Ham radio dying out and falling into disuse? Great question, and you need to be ready with a great answer. In actuality, the number of licensees continues to grow. Get the latest figure from ARRL and be prepared for the look of surprise on the visitor's face. We point out that the cell phone system is surprisingly fragile. Storms and other natural events can disable parts of the cell system. Further, coverage is not everywhere. There are serious gaps in coverage, here in Arizona, even with the major carriers. Ham radio fills in many of those gaps. Since Ham

radio gear is more powerful than cell phones, Ham signals carry over greater distances. The cell system is designed for simultaneous use by only a fraction of the subscribers. When many users try to call at the same time, the system becomes saturated. We can experience a pile up, but ham radio still works. Since our mobile radios can be powered from car batteries, Hams have a way to stay on the air even during a power line outage. The Volunteer can come up with many more good answers that help the visitors to understand why Ham radio is such a valuable public service.

The request that gives this scribe the most chuckles is the one where the visitor advises that there are about five minutes until the movie starts. "Please tell me all about Ham radio before I leave for the movie." And they are usually serious! Some visitors will try to be sarcastic or challenging. Most, however, actually want answers. The Volunteer must always be positive and cheerful. When the visitor leaves the shack, they should take with them the desire to return to the Arizona Science Center—bringing friends and family. The Volunteer is not on duty to engage in a debate.

Are you ready for the challenge, and the fun? If you think that you are ready, call Sam N7INV to discuss schedules in order to determine if Shack schedules can fit into your life. If it can, Sam will advise you on how to get started with an application. You can find contact information for Sam, and other C.A.R.L. officers, in the first pages of this ADAW newsletter.

And now a little Ham history. Has anyone ever received a check – an actual payment – from the FCC? Some Hams did. Following WW II, the FCC charged a Ham license fee. It was not much, but it was a cost. At some point, Congress became aware of this practice and instructed the FCC that Ham licenses were to be free. Any money collected was to be returned to the licensee. That is why some Hams received a little bonus from the Government.

This item is not exactly exclusive news, but it is worth including in the Newsletter. Owen Garriott W5LFL (SK) died on 15 April this year. He was 88. Owen was a real pioneer. He flew a number of space missions, including one on the Space Shuttle. During that mission he made what we believe to be the very first HAM QSO from space. NASA did not make any changes to the Shuttle in order to facilitate this use of Ham radio during a NASA mission. In fact, Owen used his own rig, an HT that had an extra battery to which it was taped. There was no Ham antenna on the Shuttle. As reported, Owen held the HT next to one of the Shuttle windows and operated successfully. Gary K9HDU, of the West Valley club, recorded a QSO during one pass of the shuttle. A copy of that audio file has been archived at W7ASC. Thank you, Gary!


W7ASC had its own historic event about a decade ago. Andrea KE7OPV was the first 10-year-old girl to volunteer at W7ASC. It took quite a bit of convincing for the Science Center to allow her to be issued a volunteer badge, but everyone agreed that she did a great job.

cation project where her Ham radio skills were critical to its success. Her teacher was beginning to undertake the task of explaining radio concepts to prepare her for the project. This teacher was very relieved when Andrea told him that she was a licensed radio amateur.



Here, in his own words, is the story of how Larry W7LDT, one of the new volunteers at W7ASC, joined the HAM community.

"I am one of the new volunteers at W7ASC. I hold Amateur Extra Class and was first licensed in 2000.

When I was 11 years old, in 5th grade (Circa 1965), my big brother got his novice ticket and started building some pretty fancy Heathkit radios. I was interested and sat in his shack (closet) and watched. He explained a lot of things, but I didn't get it. I was too interested in airplanes to have real time for radio. He even built my model airplane radio control system (another Heathkit!). That brother is Ron Taylor, WA7GIL, a 2nd year volunteer at W7ASC and my reason for volunteering.

Jump ahead to 1989. Ron was up at his cabin on the rim when word came that our beloved grandfather had died. There weren't cell phones yet. We had to send the Sheriff to find Ron and deliver the news. That's the first time I thought, too bad I'm not a ham, I could have called him on the radio.

Now, it's 2000. I am very active with an RC model airplane club. There were so many people in the club that on any given day at the field I might only get in two flights. The radios were all on 72 MHz and you have to wait your turn. My JR brand radio used an RF module in the back to facilitate switching frequencies. I found out that they made a module that would set me up on 50 MHz, in the 6M ham band. Nobody in the club was on 6M. I wanted that capability so I got my Technician Ticket and was on the air while in the air.

I got the HF bug not long after getting the Tech. I studied real hard, passed the test and the 5 WPM code test. I was a General. I liked the idea of having full ham spectrum privileges, so I got the Extra about three months later.

My original call was KD7IWW. It wasn't bad on CW but on SSB, it was a nightmare. I had to repeat the I-W-W part multiple times to DXers. I looked into the vanity call situation and found that a callsign with my initials was available. Thus, I became W7LDT." 73 de Larry

"Have you ever wondered if you could work 100 DXCC entities in a weekend? How about with a low power modest station in the bottom of the sunspot cycle?" We are about to find out. We welcome Bill, K6WSC, as he presents "DXCC in a Weekend." This will feature the world of contesting, but savvy Dxers have long understood that contesting is a great way to progress in life long DX goals.

Bill K6WSC, although continuously licensed since 1969, was largely QRT for 37 years until 2008 when he got hooked on the Sport of Amateur Radio, Contesting. Primarily a CW operator, Bill enjoys both DX and domestic contests. He is a member of the Arizona Outlaws Contest Club, Chairman of the Arizona QSO Party, and past president of the Southern Arizona DX Association.
