

- Oct 1971 ARA members cautioned on using auto patch to call "Time of Day" for time and temperature due to sponsor messages being "potentially commercial."
- Aug 1976 Paradise Valley legalizes radio towers up to 60' without the need of a special use permit.
- Aug 1979 US Senator Barry Goldwater, K7UGA, receives Arizona Ham of the Year award from ARCA at the Fort Tuthill hamfest.
- Oct 1979 ARA receives US Forestry service approval to build Mount Ord building.
- Aug 1981 ARA board approves the purchase of a storm proof Super Station Master antenna for Mount Ord.
- Aug 1985 Los Angeles police and fire departments have now gone on the record desiring greater access to amateur radio, especially during times of emergency.
- Aug 1998 Lance Halle receives plaques from ARRL for outstanding volunteer of the year and from the FCC for his work on a difficult interference case.
- Aug 2000 Christine, N7PVL, becomes Squelch Tail Editor
- Aug 2000 ARA completes purchase of Pinal peak site.
- Aug 2001 Craig Kingston's Eagle Scout project was a tremendous success and benefit to the ARA at the Pinal Peak site.
- Aug 2002 ARA VHF repeater is now officially coordinated as a "Portable" repeater.
- Aug 14, 2003 Power blackout struck Northeastern states. Amateur radio activated to support multiple organizations with varying needs.





