AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE DEMONSTRATION STATION

The repeater is located on South Mountain.

Honing our Skills - Broadening our Horizons

This month, I have asked Rusty, WA8ZID, to document W7ASC's return to the world of satellites. It has been a long time since we worked anyone by satellite, and we never really got the hang of it. Three of us working together to manage transmit, receive, and tracking looked more like the Keystone Cops than amateur radio operators. Rusty has an impressive success rate working FM satellites with his mobile rig and is working to get us up to speed from the Harkins Ham Shack. Here's his report on the subject.

Satellite Operation at Harkins Ham Shack – by Rusty, WA8ZID

While ASC was shutdown during the peak of pandemic, new feedline was installed for all our antennas, including the two for our VHF/UHF AZ/EL antennas, which meant satellite operations were possible via our TS-790A rig. Tom AD7PM and I fired up that rig right before Labor Day and let other satellite operators know via Twitter that we'd be trying to get some contacts. FM satellites are much easier to use so we chose that mode for our first try.

We tried SO-50 as that was the first satellite in range. We could hear a number of stations and made one contact with a well-known satellite operator, Patrick WD9EWK, who was on

the DM34/44 grid line near Sunset Point just off I-17. The antennas are quite directional and we had trouble keeping them aimed so no other contacts were made, but the system works! Patrick came to the shack later that day and shared a lot of tips to help us work the satellites regularly. He did tell us other stations were trying to contact us as well but we just could not hear them.

The TS-790 does have SSB capability and full duplex (separate transmit and receive), so we should be able to spot ourselves on the linear satellites. Somewhere down the road we will try that. Having the ASC visitors see us use a satellite can be a great demonstration of what we can do as amateur radio operators. I am hopeful we can make it a regular occurrence.

Kudos, Rusty and Tom

Good work, guys. We look forward to future reports as you work out the remaining kinks so we can consider satellite operation another arrow in our quiver of amateur radio modalities. Then, maybe we should augment our "On The Air" sign with an "On Orbit" sign.

Mingus Mountain Profile courtesy of Dennis Campbell

Location – Mingus Mountain Black Hills Range Cottonwood, AZ

Discussions of this location began in the fall of 2014 with the site owners. The ARA board approved the site lease in February of 2015 and began the process of application and paperwork. Users probably are unaware of the extensive work done by the technical committee setting up a repeater site.

Significant technical planning is required to avoid conflict with other frequencies at the site. In consultation with the AZ Frequency Coordination Committee the frequency pair proposed was a previously used pair at the old Valley National Bank (Bank One) building in Phoenix. Once approved a review of what frequencies are in use was done to determine the interaction between them and the proposed transmit / receive pair. Next calculations are run to determine how the repeaters will interact with the existing frequencies and what filtering will need to be done to avoid conflicts.

System specifications are decided for radios, duplexers, controllers, antennas, filters, racks and hardware. All have to be compatible. Then items are ordered, received and the whole system is assembled. The rack was built in a board member's garage from existing and new equipment in the spring and summer of 2015. Racks were completed by the end of July. Testing was done locally before deployment. August 1st everything was ready for the installation planned the weekend of August 8 and 9 2015. The crew enjoyed the sun and endured the rain to be successful. Installation spanned two twelve hour days with a crew of eight.

The ARA repeaters became operational @ Mingus Mountain August 9th of 2015.

Latitude / Longitude: 34.701030 -112.117278

Elevation – 7826 ft.

Radios – Four modified Motorola Micor radios and 1 CDM pair.

There are two repeaters operating on Mingus Mountain. The 146.820–162.2 repeater is part of the Metrolink system. Autopatch service is available on the Metrolink system.

The 448.500-100.0 is part of the Rimlink system. The radios

can be reconfigured as needed for special use. There is also a control radio for site.

Antennas – A Super Stationmaster is used for the UHF repeater and DB224 for VHF repeater. The antennas are located on top of the 40 ft. tower. Since the site is right on the edge of the mountain, and downhill from the other installations, a tall tower is not necessary.

Power supply - Astron RS-50M

Controller - The radios are all controlled by one Link Communications RLC-3 Repeater Controller which allows all the radios to be interconnected as required.

Redundancy – Battery backup
