# License Testing Information

When you are ready to take an exam for an Amateur Radio license, there are Volunteer Examiners available to assist you. Each Applicant will need to bring a picture ID (some test sessions require two forms of identification). If you are upgrading your class of license, be sure to bring the original (and a copy) of your license and/or Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination (C.S.C.E.). There may be a fee required.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Dates, times, locations, fees may change. Arrive promptly at time listed. Fees may vary and exact change or check is required at most sessions. Call test session contact to confirm information. Walk-ins are permitted unless otherwise specified.



#### No President's Corner this month

There was no President's Corner for September, which I place in the following month's ADAW. In its place, I have written some club history.

- Club's Communicator newsletter for September

#### **Superstition ARC Club History** - Larry, WB7C

My days with the club began in March 1976, at the age of 23. A member heard me locally on HF and invited me to the Superstition ARC meeting coming up on the third Wednesday of March. The club met in an Apache Junction High School classroom.

Bill Falk, K7WJF was the President, and Jerry Navarre, WA7RDC was VP. Bill drew schematics on the chalkboard and discussed circuits, such as the Hartley and Colpitts oscillators. These circuits had to be identified by examinees for an amateur radio license. At one time, test takers had to draw the schematics!

He also promoted message traffic handling. Bill set up a club booth on a street corner, taking messages from the public that could be relayed via ham radio and delivered to relatives or friends across the country.

#### **EARLY YEARS**

During my time as editor of the newsletter, I came across the 1974 meeting notice postcard mailed by the Secretary. When I joined in 1976, the newsletter was being produced by President Bill Falk on a hand-cranked mimeograph machine.

In mimeograph work, the editor types the newsletter onto stencil sheets instead of paper. The stencil's raised letters will then be inked and pressed against a sheet of paper to produce a copy of the news page. The stencil is attached to the roller, which is then turned to roll the stencil through the ink bath, then to roll against paper being inserted into the paper feed. Out comes one copy after another.

Mimeograph ink can be a mess to work with. It stains the skin, and is hard to wash off. It can ruin clothes with permanent stains. Photocopying became the go-to technology for reproducing a couple dozen, or more, newsletters.

In circa 1977, the FCC had done away with special rules for licensing of repeaters. The club started the 147.12 repeater and applied for a club license from the FCC.

We received WB7TJD, which I dubbed, "We bought 7 Tasty Jelly Doughnuts." Proper phonetics today would call for "Whiskey Bravo 7 Tango Juliet Delta." But it was fitting because we served doughnuts at our meetings.

On July 8, 1978, the Superstition Amateur Radio Club filed with Arizona's Corporation Commission for Incorporation. We were building a repeater home for our 147.12 WB7TJD/Repeater. Incorporation protects the membership from being individually liable for damages if someone is hurt while working

on a club project.

#### **SERVING THE EAST VALLEY SINCE 1973**

I like to stay on the side of caution when I don't know something. The year, 1973, has been floated around the club for decades as when the club was begun. In 1998, when I was editor of the Communicator newsletter, a 25th Anniversary banner adorned the cover of each issue throughout the year.

I recently asked Jerry, WA7RDC, our living co-founder for input on this topic.

"(The late) Wayne Schweikert, K2RUW and I co-founded the club in either 1972 or 1973; I don't remember the year, but for sure, the club was here in 1973." That is as good an answer as I can get these days, because we have no founding paperwork. But, we know from Jerry's words, that the club has been here at least since 1973. We have no certainty about 1972.

#### CLUB MEETING LOCATIONS OVER THE YEARS

The club's first years were in Apache Junction, but when we left the Apache Junction schools, we began a migration westward into various locations in Mesa. They include the Lutheran church at 96th Street and Brown Rd, the Methodist Church on 56th Street and Main in 1999, the basement of the Mesa Community College Clock Tower and RadioShack.com on Country Club and Southern. As well, we had the Mesa Utilities Office on Decatur Street, east of Power Road and our current location at the Charles K Luster Building.

Now, of course, because of COVID 19, since Marh 2020, our meetings were held exclusively online. The club returned in person meetings in June and July, 2021, at the Greek Orthodox church in Chandler. In September 2021, our meetings returned to the Charles K. Luster Building in Mesa.

With all of these locations, the club has definitely served the East Valley since its start. As far as I know, Jerry, WA7RDC is the only living soul from that era, and I didn't know of the club until three years later.

# A CLUB MEETING IN 1999 FEATURING LEW McCOY, W1ICP

I will never forget this meeting, in the 56th Street church. I believe Lew McCoy was editor of CQ Magazine at the time. We had 99 in attendance.

W1ICP told a story of loading up a kW amplifier into a short antenna on 75 meters. His wife interrupted him and said that she could hear him in the toilet in the bathroom. He put her on the mic and had to check for himself. Sure enough, there was some RF rectification in the toilet!

"That has got to be fixed," his wife said.

"NOT UNTIL WE HAVE A PARTY!!" he said, to a roar of laughter.
