Have you had any experience with encryption? Enigma? That's the question we were asked at the August 12 meeting of the Arizona Amateur Radio Club. If your answer was a NO, the program was certain to enlighten you on the subject.

Encryption is the process of encoding information. This process converts the original representation of the information, known as plaintext (written in lowercase), into an alternative form known as CIPHERTEXT (written in all uppercase). Ideally, only authorized parties can decipher a CIPHERTEXT back to the original plaintext message. Encryption does not itself prevent reception by others, but it denies the intelligible content to a would-be interceptor. Only people who know how to return CIPHERTEXT to its original form can read it. To anyone else, it'll appear as gibberish or a meaningless collection of characters.

The German Enigma Cipher machine changes plaintext letters into CIPHERTEXT letters. The Germans developed this machine and used it before and during WW2. The British worked on deciphering the messages and had some success in doing it with the help of a very talented Polish mathematician. An Enigma machine was used at the sending end to encode and another one used at the receiving end to decode. The two machines must have the same settings to encode and decode the message. These settings were on a chart that had the settings tabulated for each day. There were 20 columns of settings for each day and most columns had many choices. There were over 10 to the 25th power of possible settings (over a trillion trillions). No wonder the Germans considered it impossible for an interceptor to decode a message. The Russians, US Army, and a few others developed similar machines.

With Labor Day comes the unofficial end of summer. Our members have kept busy throughout the summer with projects to help further our EmComm focus. Some of our members, who are also Red Cross volunteers, have been supporting disaster responses for wildfires and flooding across the state. In the last couple of weeks, we have partnered with DEMA and Gila County Emergency Management to complete a damage assessment of those areas that were flooded following rains in and around the communities of Miami and Globe. Teams visited the homes and spoke with residents to ascertain the extent of the flooding damage and to offer assistance and referrals to residents whose homes were damaged.

In the Phoenix area, some of our members have been working to assemble "Go-Kits" that will be positioned at Red Cross offices around the state. We have several Icom IC-2100H 2-meter mobiles together with power supplies, mobile antennae and related accessories to allow for rapid deployment by Red Cross radio teams when needed. We are also working on two HF kits that will include a Yaesu FT-897, G5RV antenna, Signalink, power supply and accessories that can be quickly deployed when required.

At our regional office in Phoenix, we have added an AREDN® mesh node with a little help from some friends at the Arizona Mesh Organization. We also carry spare AREDN® mesh nodes on our Communications Van to be able to establish portable nodes at shelters or other sites when necessary. The AREDN® acronym stands for "Amateur Radio Emergency Data Network" and it provides a way for Amateur Radio operators to create high-speed ad hoc Data Networks for use in emergency and service-oriented communications. There are several nodes currently in service around the state including Mesa, Maricopa, Phoenix, Prescott and Wickenburg with more planned in the near future.

At our last meeting, we discussed a new VoIP tool that some of our members have been experimenting with. Hamshack Hotline (HH) is a dedicated Voice-Over-Internet-Protocol (VOIP) network that is free to amateur radio operators around the world. The goal of the Hamshack Hotline is not to replace the traffic that is carried over RF, but rather augment it when conditions are diminished or otherwise busy. We have successfully installed HH extensions in our radio room at the Red Cross in Phoenix and also in our Communication Van. HH

relies on the internet to provide its service and once a phone has been connected to the service, it can be moved anywhere you have an internet connection, even wirelessly using a MiFi. This allows an operator to be reached at the same extension number no matter where in the world he or she may be. This allows us to perform some routine tasks like coordinating teams that might be working out of range of simplex or repeater coverage. While this is not something we would rely on in an emergency or disaster scenario, it does provide another channel of communications and can free up repeaters when coordinating tests or repairs that may require lots of back-and-forth discussions.

As we look to the fall, our K7ARC VE team is getting ready to resume monthly testing. Beginning October 2nd, and every first Saturday thereafter, we will be offering amateur radio license testing at the Phoenix chapter of the American Red Cross. This is in addition to the Arizona Amateur Radio Club's test sessions held on the last Saturday of each month. Anyone looking to upgrade or earn a new amateur radio license can register for one of our free monthly sessions online by visiting our club website at www.k7arc.org.

We encourage any hams that are interested in Emergency Communications to check out the Arizona Red Cross Communications Club. We have members across the state and are always happy to welcome new hams and more experienced operators interested in learning how we support the Red Cross in Arizona and New Mexico. We have our general meeting on the second Tuesday of the month and also get together most Saturday mornings at the Phoenix chapter to test equipment and learn new skills. There are a few members in the Tucson area that are working closely with the Southern Arizona Red Cross chapter covering the southern counties in Arizona. 

**Redundancy Backup** – this site is on the Fire Department emergency generator for back up power


**Controller** - The radios are all controlled by one Link Communications RLC-4 Repeater



### History of the West Valley ARC

Jim Rogers, N7YT

The original repeater committee consisted of Sam Lewbel W7JHQ, Stan Edgeton K8RAL, Tom Watts NY7S, Marty Shapiro KA7GKN, and George Hands KE7DH. They had the task of acquiring repeaters and getting them on the air.

In 1987, they obtained a Spectrum SCR-2000 to put on Boswell Hospital using the repeater pairing of 147.90 input and 147.30 output. This radio had an output of eight watts and did not have autopatch at the time. They used Don Starkey's call sign of K7NHR/R. This machine experienced intermod and interference over the next few years.

A second repeater came about in 1987 and installed on Del Webb Hospital using the pairing 145.29 output and 144.69 input and George Hands call of KE7DH. They used a Yeasu FTR-2410 with an output of 10 watts. Again, intermod and interference was a problem with this repeater as well.

With the issues they were having it was decided in 1993 to relinquish the 145.29 pair and retuned the Yeasu for 147.300 pair and it is still in use today. Although we have gone thru several different radios over the years. Currently, we have a Yeasu VXR-7000. In 2001, the club wanted to put a better antenna on the Del Webb repeater. So, 30 feet of Tower and a DB-224 was purchased, and after David Cain got all the FAA paper work approved, it was installed and remains there to this day.

After Tom Watts passed away, the club asked his son if it would be possible to get Tom's call to use on the 147.300 repeater, and he approved. So today we honor Tom by using NY7S on that repeater.

Our 70cm repeater was installed in 1991 on Boswell Hospital using 449.800/444.800 frequencies. Sam Lewbel lent his call for this repeater, but in 1992 after Sam passed away, they had to change the call to W7SHQ. Tom Watts obtained Sam's call in 1997 after the FCC had deactivated it. We still have that call today.
