Discussion is currently underway regarding the feasibility of holding the convention with the 2023 Copafest in October at Ak-Chin Casino. More will follow on that as talks progress.

The Dayton Hamvention committee has chosen the theme for the 2023 event-Innovation! There are so many innovations in the Amateur Radio now that the Hamvention team wanted to capture that excitement. Jim Storms, AB8YK is the 2023 Hamvention General Chair and he looks forward to welcoming everyone to the event.

The Dayton Hamvention will be held in Xenia, Ohio at the Green County Fairgrounds. Tickets are available for purchase on-line. For all the information and current updates, visit the web site at hamvention.org.

New Members & New Activities at CARL/W7ASC in 2022 In working on the December column, I am quite excited & thankful to look back on the expanded activities of our club and the improvements that we have made to the Harkins Ham Shack - W7ASC - in 2022. These improvements are thanks in no small part to the infusion of new members this past year to where we are now finding our club's activity level has grown exponentially.

Thomas NE7X came to CARL in early 2022 and brought a new level of insight into how a club could operate more actively. Using his research and guidance we pursued a pair of grants to improve our operations & W7ASC's visitor appeal. Your editor plans to do a feature about Thomas soon in a future column! This month, I asked our two newest members, Jerry K1GJQ & Chris W7AMD/G4AMD, to discuss their motives for joining CARL plus describe their experiences as volunteers.

### Jerry Quenneville - K1GJQ

I've been licensed since 1977 and before that had been a shortwave listener for about 10 years. So radio has been a hobby for most of my life, and I knew at a fairly early age that I wanted to be a ham. I earned my Novice ticket through W1PUO, the University of Massachusetts-Amherst ham club. test. My original call was WB1COV and my first contact was a CW QSO with station in Globe AZ using the UMass club station.

Following graduation, I began a 20-year career as a communications engineer in the US Air Force – a dream job following my earlier years as a radio hobbyist. Even outside the US, during a 3-year overseas tour in Germany, I held the reciprocal license DA1QG and enjoyed working a whole host of different countries, some of which I've still never worked from stateside. My volunteer experience has been very rewarding, and I strongly recommend it to any licensed ham who enjoys meeting curious kids and adults who come by, and who wants to help spread the word about ham radio.

Thanks to the great team and station at the Arizona Science Center, my interest in radio keeps growing. In terms of operating from home, I continue to experiment with antennas and the challenges of operating under the restrictions of a homeowners' association. I have also discovered other ways to apply my radio skills by volunteering with the American Red Cross as a member of the Arizona-New Mexico region's Disaster Support Technology team. After some 45 years as a licensed ham, the hobby continues to open up new opportunities for me and keeps the learning alive.

### Chris Heavens - W7AMD, G4AMD licensed since 1971

I've been fortunate to be involved with Radio communication, or Wireless and Telecommunications technology from both a professional point of view as well as a "radio ham" for over 50 years now . . . a very long time indeed! Having a lifetime of radio communications experience has made it easy and fun for me to reach out to the Amateur Radio world and offer my technical support to both new and experienced radio operators.



### ARA Portable Repeater - James Wasson

The ARA portable repeater can operate on one of several frequencies, 145.17, 145.19, 145.21 and 145.23 MHz with a negative offset of 600 kHz and a PL tone of 162.2 Hz. It is possible to link the portable repeater to 1 of 26 different 70cm sites either through linking frequencies or standard repeater frequencies across the ARA repeater constellations widening or expanding the linked repeaters coverage area as necessary. The VHF repeater uses two Motorola CDM radios (one for TX and one for RX), while the link radio is a single UHF Motorola CDM radio for half duplex linking. The 2m duplexer has a diplexer strapped to the top for 2m repeater operation as well as 70cm linking capability.

September 17, 2022 – The ARA portable repeater was most recently deployed to support the Barn Burner race in Flagstaff through the Coconino and Kaibab National Forests.



Controller - The radios are all controlled by one Link Communications Repeater Controller which allows all the radios to be interconnected as required.

On Sunday, 10-30-2022, seven ARA members ascended Pinal Peak to replace the faulty 2-meter antenna. The planned trip had been postponed for several weeks due to weather forecasts which proved to be very accurate.

The group included Dennis Campbell AE7WU, Joe Godfrey AE7JG, Mike Montalvo KF7MBK, Brian McCarthy AK7F, James Wasson N7ELL, John Braden K7LKL, and Bill Jackson N9JVW. This gave the team two tower climbers, enough ground crew to support the tower work, and at the same time take measurements inside the building at the same time.

The team removed the old antenna, put a termination on the hardline and swept it across the 2-meter band to verify it had not sustained any damage. After installing the Sinclair Technologies SC226 Aurora collinear Omni, 6 dBd antenna and it was secured in place, the inside team swept it to verify reasonable VSWR.

Before leaving they activated all the radios in the rack and, using 147.200, made contact with a station in Bouse and a station in Casa Grande who was using 147.200. Testing before departing a site is a routine practice. The weather cooperated with nice temperatures, minimal breezes, and zero precipitation the whole day. The team was there from about 10:30 AM to about 4:15 PM. Very successful trip.

Dennis reflected on the days' activities. During the 2100 net that night, I found I could once again receive 147.200 from the Lazy Boy chair in my living room in North Peoria with a low enough noise floor to understand all that was said on the RimLink.
