#### AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE DEMONSTRATION STATION

W7ASC is a Demonstration Station for the Amateur Radio (public) Service. The Volunteers who operate the station are members of the Center for Amateur Radio Learning (C.A.R.L.), a 501(c)(3) corporation. W7ASC is open to all who visit Arizona Science Center (ASC) during those hours when ASC is open. The station is located on the third floor of the Science Center in the "My Digital World" gallery. Direct phone number is 602-716-2082.

ASC is open daily, 10:30 a.m. -4:00 p.m. The ham shack hours are essentially the same, dependent on availability of volunteer staff. Our Twitter feed can be accessed at <a href="twitter.com/w7asc\_arc">twitter.com/w7asc\_arc</a>. We hope to have our web page back up shortly. You can also learn more about us by searching our W7ASC callsign on QRZ.com

All licensed amateur radio operators are invited to join us Wednesday and Saturday mornings at 0900 MST for the CARL Net on 440.375 MHz, offset +5.0, tone 100. The repeater is located on South Mountain.

#### **W7ASC Station Improvements**

Our W7ASC volunteers are continuing to make station improvements thanks to the generous grant provided by ARDC. The station has really come a long way in the last six months as noted by our president Jack KD7ROB. Our most recent improvements are as follows.

CARL's new FlexRadio 6400 was delivered around the first of October to Thomas' NE7X QTH. It was installed in W7ASC the following day in our west station. Paul KI7LW is working on a "living document" to provide basic operational instructions to help the W7ASC volunteers get up and running with this evolutionary transceiver. I used the initial "rev 0" draft last Wednesday and was able to get the FlexRadio up and running on 20m SSB all by myself. Its spectrum and waterfall graphics are first class and immediately initiated interest from an ASC visitor upon boot up. I understand that FT8 operational capability on the FlexRadio system was achieved last Thursday.

We installed an additional monitor on the exterior wall of our east station. This will allow Arizona Science Center visitors to better visualize what our control operator, our satellite communications system, and the satellite itself are doing when we are making these contacts.

W7ASC's east and west stations are now networked together. Per Rusty WA8ZID, the networking allows him to

maintain logs for both radio positions in near real time. It also allows the east station operator to access and operate the FlexRadio even though it is physically located in the west station. Networking capability for remote operation of the FlexRadio is being worked upon as I write this.

CARL's new GeoChron Atlas 4k display system has been enhanced with GeoChron's Ham Radio add-on bundle. This premium package provides propagation information such as a maximum usable frequency (MUF) overlay and windows showing solar terrestrial data and NOAA auroral forecasts for the poles. Another new overlay is a layer that shows recent DX cluster and radio beacon activity. This additional capability allowed me to notice a 10m opening occurring on Wednesday, 5 October that resulted in a successful FT8 contact to South Africa in the late morning.

#### Ham Radio in St. Johns, U.S.V.I.

We had several visitors stop by the shack from the small Virgin Island of St. Johns in the Caribbean recently. They reported that ham radio licenses have become quite a "hot ticket" on the island following the communications and infrastructure destruction due to Hurricane Irma in 2017. (It was followed by Hurricane Maria shortly after). After the hurricane, observers on St. Johns noted all the leaves were stripped from the trees and all the telephone poles were down. Recovery there has been slow. According to the visitors, there is still quite a bit of contention between FEMA and the islanders regarding whether their cell phone system and emergency communication system are working adequately.

#### Volunteers Needed at W7ASC

W7ASC definitely needs more volunteers to support its mission to introduce AZ Science Center visitors to ham radio. School tour groups have returned in full force this fall. The winter visitors will be here soon which results in larger crowds. Likewise, we have noted quite a bit more serious interest from adults following the pandemic. #### **ARA Site Profile – Chase Tower -** *Lance Halle, KW7LH*

The ARA began operating the Valley Center site in 1973. The building is the tallest building in the state of Arizona. Built in 1972, it is 483 feet tall. It was originally built for local financial heavyweight Valley National Bank, with which Bank One merged in 1993. Bank One merged with Chase in 2005, and the building was renamed in December 2005.

June 1997 – The ARA UHF antenna and feedline goes missing. A contractor removed it from the building in error. After extensive negotiation the contractor purchased a new antenna and the ARA restored it in the fall.

Dec 2007 ARA board approved plan to install IRLP at Chase tower.

Location – 201 N Central Ave, Phoenix, Maricopa County

Coverage Area - Central Phoenix, extending into the closest metro cities

Elevation – 1690, Building 483 feet (147 m) tall. 40 stories.

Radios – Three modified Motorola Micor radios There are two repeaters operating on VHF 146.64 MHz(-) 162.2 and UHF 444.300 (+) 100.0. The site has IRLP & EchoLink connectivity on the 444.300 repeater.

Auto-patch - Service was discontinued on Bank One.

Antennas – Four Omni fiberglass antennas support

the systems in use for VHF (receive), UHF (receive and transmit), and control radio, and an Andrew's DB224, 4-Bay Dipole Omni Base Station Antenna for VHF transmit. This VHF antenna configuration is unique for ARA repeaters that normally use the same antenna for receive and transmit. Therefore, the receive footprint and transmit footprint for the Chase VHF repeater are slightly different from one another. You may be able to hear or access the repeater slightly better than you can access or hear it. But it isn't an "alligator" (all mouth, no ears) or an "elephant" (all ears, no mouth).

Power / Redundancy — Utility powers an Astron 12V RS-35M power supply.

Controller - The radios are all controlled by one Link Communications RLC-3 Repeater Controller which allows all the radios to be interconnected as required.

One of the things about MARCA is that our meeting, and often our events, tends to be after the ADAW deadline, but this can be a "blessing in disguise" as it allows for telling you about upcoming events!

To report on past events, the MARCA meeting in September was at the Denny's at 48th Street and University and included a VE Exam session. Several folks attended via Zoom.

The speaker for our November meeting, to be held November 15, will be your humble reporter. The topic I'll be speaking about is the Apollo Guidance Systems which got people to the Moon and back. What got me started on this was looking at a 500ml bottle of water, and an apartment-size fridge that I knew to be roughly the same size as the primary guidance system on Apollo, and thinking that with today's technology, we could easily cram it into the water bottle. So I started doing some research into the Apollo Guidance Systems to see if my thoughts were actually correct. I got some surprises along the way, both from early 1960s technology and from some current technology.

I'll have a couple of "pass-around" demos, and one "hand-waving" demo with a prop that hopefully will be large enough for folks to see. The hand-waving demo will explain a bit about how a couple of key technologies used in the primary guidance system actually worked. Although I'll include photos of each for the benefit of the Zoom attendees, they'll probably be better in person.

The actual timing of this talk may be somewhat fortunate in that NASA is trying to launch Artemis I in an unmanned mission to the Moon and back. As of this writing, they have not yet announced the exact date that they'll try again to launch, but they are hoping to launch sometime in November.


