John Marshall, WA7BSR, became a silent key on November 21,2022.

John was first licensed in 1965 and was a member of the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) for more than 10 years. He served as the Public Information Coordinator and Public Information Officer for the Arizona Section from 2014 until 2022.

John was the president of the QCWA Arizona Chapter from 2018 to 2020 and vice-president from 2014 to 2018. He was best known for the many photographs he took of the events throughout Arizona for the ARRL and Arizona clubs.

John served in the US Army from 1966 to 1969 in Bamberg, Germany as the Communications Chief. During his service, he established a MARS (Military Affiliate Radio System), was a Cryptography Custodian, and PIO Photographer.

John studied Industrial Science and Multimedia at Western Washington University graduating in 1973. His many occupations included Chief Engineer for Birchbay Broadcasting at KARI-AM and KERI-FM and Engineering Lab Manager for Tally Corporation where he was involved in the development of a line of dot matrix printers. Two patents were granted there. He was an Applications Engineer at Wyle Electronics and Hamilton Avent, the Distribution Sales Manager for Digital Equipment Corporation, President of M-Tech, and Senior Engineer for Verizon Wireless and Metawave.

John also found time to be an instructor in the Computer Network Technology program at Renton Technical College from September 1999 until August 2010. He said "Ninety-Four percent of students that take the CompTIA A+ exam pass on their first try."

John was an Advanced Square Dance Caller at Callerlab, the International Association of Square Dance Callers and an accomplished photographer. He was the owner of soundphoto.com for 57 years specializing in Wedding, Travel, and Portrait Photography. Even though he did not teach photography, he was always willing to share his knowledge and expertise with a beginner.

John and his wife Ana were big band enthusiasts. They could often be found at Iron Skillet in Glendale, AZ, whenever the community band of music teachers was playing there. They enjoyed sharing the music and dinner with friends.

When you are ready to take an exam for an Amateur Radio license, there are Volunteer Examiners available to assist you. Each Applicant will need to bring a picture ID (some test sessions require two forms of identification). An FCC-issued FRN number is required. ARA History

February 18, 1968 - ARA members installed a 2M antenna on the KOOL tower on South Mountain to support a new repeater installation under the call sign WA7CEM. Frequencies to be used were 146.94 / 146.34. The tower is located at 33.334°N 112.062°W at a height above average terrain of 1,654 ft. Several of the KOOL engineers were Hams.

February 1969 - ARA meeting conducted a transmitter hunt with 20 mobiles participating. Dave Cunningham, W7BEP, won with the shortest mileage and time. Dave was the winner of the Motorola "Handi-Talkie" first prize.

February 12, 1978, Sunday, the ARCA Winter Hamfest was held at South Mountain Park with over 500 in attendance. Temperatures for the hamfest were cold at Low 46', High 59'

February 1997 - Jim Hoff reported that the Mt. Ord 147.36 repeater having a reduced range due to weather (ice/wind) damage to the repeaters antenna.

February 1998 - ARRL SW Division representative attends the ARA General meeting to present Lance Halle with plaque for his efforts related to interference management.


February 1998 - Tech committee braved the cold and snow to make necessary repairs to an antenna at Mt Elden.

February 1999 - ARA tech committee prepares for the new area code overlay plan which will include the 480 and 623 area codes. Ten digit dialing will be required on the ARA repeater auto-patch. Bank One will be the first site upgraded.

February 2003 - Members notified of pending Scottsdale construction for a planned site upgrade. The VHF and UHF will be off the air during the construction.

February 2013 - ARA approves purchase of repeater equipment to support the repeater installation at Daisy Mountain Fire Department.
