Contest Tip this month – contest setup files, specifically macros. I use N1MM but every contest logging program allows you to set up macros using the F keys. Study the macros and use them to simplify and automate your operating. I do SO2R a lot so I've been playing with macros that will put both my ears on the 2nd radio while the other radio is transmitting. If I want to use my RX Antenna on my older Kenwood TS-2000 I have to go into the menu to turn it on and then same to turn it off. Not very convenient to switch between receiving on my TX antenna and the RX antenna. I found a macro that N2IC uses in N1MM where I programmed the macro into one of my F keys and now I can go to the RX antenna by pushing a button. Much simpler process. If you study the macros available, you might find one you can put to good use.

Our members include elite contesters who have operated from many DXCC entities around the globe as well as beginners wanting to learn more and who may submit a score of only a few QSOs. We encourage all stations, big or small, to get on and participate in contests and make contacts. There are excellent resources among club members and on our club website for contesting help.



If you do not have an FCC-issued FRN number, visit <u>https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/publicHome.do</u> to obtain one. If you are upgrading your class of license, be sure to bring the original (and a copy) of your license and/or Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination (C.S.C.E.). There may be an exam fee required.

PLEASE NOTE: Dates, times, locations, fees may change. Arrive promptly at time listed. Fees may vary and exact change or check is required at most sessions. Call test session contact to confirm information. Walk-ins are permitted unless otherwise specified.

AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE DEMONSTRATION STATION

W7ASC is a Demonstration Station for the Amateur Radio (public) Service. The Volunteers who operate the station are members of the Center for Amateur Radio Learning (C.A.R.L.), a 501(c)(3) corporation. The Harkins Ham Shack is open to all who visit Arizona Science Center (ASC) during those hours when ASC is open. The station is located on the third floor of the Science Center in the "My Digital World" gallery. Direct phone number is 602-716-2082.

ASC is open daily, 10:30 a.m. -4:00 p.m. The ham shack is manned by our volunteer staff who are typically in the shack on weekdays until approximately 2:00 p.m. You can also learn more about CARL and W7ASC by searching our W7ASC callsign on <u>QRZ.com</u>.

Volunteers Needed at W7ASC for Ham Radio/STEM Outreach

We need some additional volunteers to help CARL's efforts to create an interest in ham radio and STEM education at W7ASC!! As a volunteer, you would interact with both young and old who are visiting the Arizona Science Center because they are interested and inquisitive about science.

As many of us have read recently, the Phoenix area is short handed on technically skilled workers to support the new industries growing up around us. I personally feel that ham radio's "citizen science" approach to discovery could help further an interest in STEM education among Arizona's schoolchildren so we can create the next generation of our much needed technical workforce.

I speak with many young adults that grew up in the Phoenix area and they fondly remember the ham shack and sending their name in Morse Code on their school field trips. We make a big impression with this activity! Recently, we have seen a resurgence in interest in the Morse Code among the school tour groups thanks to it being adopted as an old school hack on the "Stranger Things" series.

It is quite heartening when we see a school tour group's initial visitors to the Harkins Ham Shack start dragging their friends and classmates over and insisting they need to try Morse Code. We regularly get our school age visitors telling us that "Morse Code is really cool!" A volunteer does not need to be very proficient at code. I personally have found our Morse Code activity to be beneficial in exercising my Tech Plus 5wpm skills that were never really used after my initial code test.

Beyond the Morse Code activity, we talk to visitors who often have questions about radio. Some have experience with radios including some who are hams. These conversations can evolve into multiple topics about the broad interests of ham radio. Folks who work in IT seem drawn to our activities and displays in the Harkins Ham Shack. Their professional familiarity with WiFi network operations allows us to reach out to inform them of amateur radio MESH network activities.

W7ASC has upped its game in operating the satellites since the pandemic. This allows for higher level discussions such as how satellite repeater systems work and line of site communications. We proudly boast of our contact with the ISS in 2022.

Our GeoChron world map provides real time locations of the sats along with their current reception pattern. This visual insight really allows the conversations to go much deeper. The GeoChron also shows geomagnetic data which allows our conversations to branch of into subjects such as solar weather, auroras, and their effects on radio propagation.

Our FlexRadio's spectral activity and waterfall displays often generate inquiries as they give our interested visitors a visual real time sense of radio activity across the spectrum. The waterfall display can provide a great visual representation of the dits and dahs when we monitor CW beacons and conversations.

As you can see, CARL has the tools to allow us to reach visitors to create an interest in ham radio and its associated technologies on multiple levels. We would love to hear from you if you want to help us with our ham radio and STEM outreach mission.

Tech Committee

The tech committee completed two trips recently.

Daisy ARA this repeater began Operation Saturday, January 4, 2014.

The Daisy Mountain site which is linked to Metro Link recently began having trouble reaching Shaw Butte. Dennis AE7WU, and Mike KF7MBK visited the site to investigate. The link radio was found to be operating within specifications. The radio was removed to be bench tested. Lance KW7LH tested the radio and increased the transmit power to 10W to ensure the power was sufficient to reach Shaw Butte on the narrow path. The radio will be reinstalled soon and the link antenna realigned to optimize the SNR for the link.

The ARA Mt Elden site became operational in June 1996.

Dennis AE7WU, and John K7LKL, traveled to Mt Elden to participate in the annual site inspections. A replacement control radio was installed to restore functionality to the site. The site passed inspection with flying colors.

Final equipment was delivered to the site to complete the migration of the Utah link to Towers Mountain. A trip will be planned to install the final equipment and test the redesigned link to UTAH.

October 9, 1967 – Arizona Repeater Association incorporates and begins holding their meetings on the Second Tuesday of each month at 7:30 PM at the First Federal Building at 2002 Camelback Road, Phoenix.

October 1971 – ARA members cautioned on using auto patch to call "Time of Day" for time and temperature due to sponsor messages being "potentially commercial."

October 1975 – ARA Board of Directors raises the annual due from \$12 to \$15. The raise is necessary "due to the high expenses of operating five repeaters, four in Phoenix and one in Flagstaff."

October 27, 1977 – The ARA site committee announces they have successfully negotiated an East side site at Scottsdale Air Park water tower.

October 1979 – ARA receives US Forestry service approval to build Mount Ord building.

October 1, 1980 – ARA meeting held in the auditorium of the Arizona Department of Emergency and Military Affairs.

October 5, 1989 – Cal, KA7BET reported at the board meeting the ARA has 690 members.

October 2000 - The ARA has 809 members.

October 11, 2003 – Pinal Peak - Erv, John, Dennis, and Lance along with four others from MARCA went to the site and installed the new 22' Super Stationmaster antenna. The tip is at 70' AGL.

October 2004 – ARA is supporting more than 50 radios between eight different sites.

October 30, 2022 – Pinal Peak - Seven ARA members ascended Pinal Peak to replace the faulty 2-meter antenna. The planned trip had been postponed for several weeks due to weather forecasts which proved to be very accurate.
