Contest Tip this month – Greyline

The "grey line" is a band around the Earth that separates daylight from darkness. Propagation along the grey line is very efficient. One major reason for this is that the D layer, which absorbs HF signals, disappears rapidly on the sunset side of the grey line, and it has not yet built upon the sunrise side. Contesters can optimize long distance communications to various areas of the world by monitoring this band as it moves around the globe. How do you watch for grey line propagation? There are several tools to do so. There is the original Geochron clock that is neat, but expensive. Geochron launched a software-based version that will run nicely on a 4k TV or monitor. A great addition to the shack. You can also try DX Atlas by VE3NEA. N1MM has a grey line map in the program you can use at no cost. Any one of these tools will give you a

good idea of grey line propagation, especially for potential long path openings. In a contest, this will be valuable in looking for a rarer multiplier. Make sure to take advantage of grey line propagation.

Our members include elite contesters who have operated from many DXCC entities around the globe as well as beginners wanting to learn more and who may submit a score of only a few QSOs. We encourage all stations, big or small, to get on and participate in contests and make contacts. There are excellent resources among club members and on our club website for contesting help.

AOCC accomplishments -

* In Club Competition, AOCC finished #7 USA with a score of 10,006,558 points from 21 Outlaw entries. Numerically our highest club total.

* AOCC finishes #6 USA with a final score of 84,399,013 points from 58 entries in the 2023 CQWPX Contests (SSB+CW). This is our highest score in this contest.

Each Applicant will need to bring a picture ID (some test sessions require two forms of identification). An FCC-issued FRN number is required. If you do not have an FCC-issued FRN number, visit <u>https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/publicHome.do</u> to obtain one. If you are upgrading your class of license, be sure to bring the original (and a copy) of your license and/or Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination (C.S.C.E.). There may be an exam fee required.

PLEASE NOTE: Dates, times, locations, fees may change. Arrive promptly at time listed. Fees may vary and exact change or check is required at most sessions. Call test session contact to confirm information. Walk-ins are permitted unless otherwise specified.




