Silent Keys



Doctor Vinson Thompson K5VT, passed away on April 24, 2010. He was board certified in OB-Gyn and traveled extensively with the World Health Organization, primarily in Africa. He was a veteran and served with the U.S. Navy. He came to

Phoenix in 1981 and was the Director of Gyn Oncology at Maricopa Medical Center until he entered private practice. Dr. Thompson was the first Gyn Oncologist in the entire metropolitan Phoenix area. A licensed amateur radio operator since the age of 13, he was recognized as a world renowned high speed telegraph operator and held the call sign of K5VT. He was an Honorary Member of the Central Arizona DX Association, where he was also the Past President and "DXer of the Year" in 1993, Vince was named New Orleans "DXer of the Year" in 1995. He was also a life member of the ARRL and also on the ARRL DX Advisory Committee. An active and founding member of the "VooDoo Contest Group," he held radio licenses from over 60 countries.



Bernie J. Sasek, W7KQ (SK): Bernie J. Sasek W7KQ (ex W0YOY, XE2VHX, OK8KQ) passed away April 28, 2010. He was 74 and a resident of Tucson Arizona. Bernie was first licensed in 1954 as WN0YOY in Wilber, Nebraska. After upgrading to W0YOY he

was active on VHF for a few years before discovering DXing and has been an active DXer up to his passing. Bernie was active with the ARRL serving as Section Manager from 1991 to 1993. He received the SWD Meritorious Service Award in 1991, and was also very active in the VEC program. Bernie was a life member of ARRL, a member of the Southern Arizona DX Association, Central Arizona DX Association, and the Arizona Outlaws Contest Club. He was a founding member of the Southern Arizona DX Association, served as president of the organization a number of times and was currently the Secretary/Treasurer. Bernie had achieved a prestigious standing in the ARRL DXCC Honor Roll #1 program with having worked all 338 entities in mixed and phone mode, and an overall count of 354 entities confirmed. Bernie was active in contesting having operated at 6D2DX, 4B2A, and other contest stations. His current primary activity was building his country count on 30 meters. Bernie's 44 year professional career was in the commercial broadcast engineering industry, initially in Nebraska and ending with his retirement from KVOA-TV in Tucson. Bernie was preceded in passing by his wife Karen, W7QJK, in August of 2009. He is survived by sons Bill and Greg, KA7JGY. Bernie's passing is a great loss to the amateur radio community and will be sorely missed by all who knew him.

Dick told of Hiram Percy Maxim's kindness, sincerity, lively sense of humor, and appreciation of life. He related several very comical incidents that occurred in Mr. Maxim's life. I suggest that your read Alice Clink Schumacher's biography entitled "Hiram Percy Maxim." Dick convinced us all that this would be a worthwhile and enjoyable book to read.

Two of our club members, George Cooney, KQ7C, and John Kainrath, K7JHK, have been involved in a new project. Both have been regular participants in a morning net on Echolink, and George has been anxious to use a Rig Blaster as an interface between the computer and the transceiver in order to check into the weekly two-meter net using the computer. Several Arizona amateurs have already done this, but the project is still in the beginning stages for George and John. We can expect a report from one of them regarding the problems they encountered and their solutions.

Of course the attention of the AARC is being directed to Field Day, which is fast approaching (June 26-27.) 

Due to Changes made to the federal tax laws some radio clubs that are tax-exempt under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code must file the required IRS annual returns or reports before the deadline, May 15, 2010. 
